Literacy - Spelling

au/aw

(worksheet on SeeSaw)

Type "aw au" into YouTube and watch the first two clips. Then make two columns and sort the aw/au words that you heard depending on their spelling pattern. Can you think of any more words to add?



Literacy - Writing

Super Sentences

(template on SeeSaw)

Look at the "bath" picture on SeeSaw, colour in as instructed and write 3-4 sentences describing what you see. Think carefully about punctuation and finger spacing. Can you add some adjectives to make your writing more interesting?



Literacy - Reading

"My favourite part" book retell (template on SeeSaw)

Choose a book that you've recently enjoyed - it could be anything at all! Draw your favourite part of the story and write or record a few sentences to tell us what's happening, who is involved and why you like it so much.


Numeracy and Maths

Odd and even number sort (worksheet on SeeSaw)

Watch the YouTube tutorial for a reminder about how to figure out if a number is odd or even.

Then sort the numbers into two columns.



Odd and even sheep (worksheet on SeeSaw)

Colour the sheep depending on whether they are odd or even. Remember - even with the bigger numbers, you can always tell by looking at the last digit!



Numeracy and Maths

Spring tree - odd and even sum challenge (example on SeeSaw)



Draw two bare trees and label them ODD and EVEN. Have an adult write numbers on little paper leaves or blossom, then sort and stick them on the correct tree. For extra challenge, use sums too! Eq. 9+5=14 which is EVEN.
