<p><u>Shadow drawing</u></p> <p>For this activity you will need paper, a pen/pencil and toys that stand). Place the paper on the ground with the toy in the sun so the shadow hits the paper. Can you draw round it? Let me see how you get on. Can you draw something small? Can you draw something big?</p>	<p><u>Shape pizza</u></p> <p>For this activity you will need a paper plate (or a circle cut out of paper), some glue or stick tape, scissors and some coloured paper (or white paper and coloured pens). Either draw triangles, circles, squares and rectangles on your white paper and cut them out, or simply cut them from the coloured paper. Using glue or tape arrange and stick the shapes onto your pizza.</p>	<p><u>Sensory Painting</u></p> <p>For this activity you will need a piece of paper, a little coffee, paprika, hot chocolate, ginger, etc., yoghurt pots or little bowls/plates, spoons and a paintbrush (or your fingers). Spoon a little of each powder into its own pot/plate and mix carefully into a paste with a tiny bit of water. Using the paintbrush (or your fingers) paint your sensory picture – it will smell amazing!</p>	<p><u>All About You</u></p> <p>On a piece of paper draw a big flower with a round middle and six petals. In the centre of the flower write your name and age. Grown-ups - in each of the petals write one of the following statements:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Three words to describe me..... 2) I am really good at..... 3) What I like to do for fun..... 4) I want to be a When I grow up. 5) My favourite book is.... 6) My favourite film is..... 	<p><u>Play a game of I-spy with your family.....</u></p> <p>This could be: Colours - I spy with my little eye something red Clues - I spy with my little eye something that moves and has wheels Shapes- I spy with my little eye something that's a circle shape Initial letters - I spy with my little eye something beginning with 'p'</p>
<p><u>Bug Hunting</u></p> <p>Explore your garden and see what different bugs and beasties you can find. Can you name them? Remember you'll need to look under objects! Ask mummy to take a photograph and post it back on Facebook to show me what you find.</p>	<p>On a separate sheet of paper make a list of the shapes you have used (draw the shape). Now count how many circles, triangles, rectangles and squares you have used and write the number beside the correct shape on your list.</p>		<p>Ask your child and either scribe their answers into each petal or help them write the answers themselves.</p>	<p><u>Teach your family to sing a new song</u></p> <p>Think about all your favourite nursery songs - don't forget the actions! It might be Baa Baa Black Sheep, Wind a Bobbin Up or Twinkle Twinkle Little Star - have a look at our song sheet for more ideas</p>

Tick, tock, tick, tock, tick, tock.


Repeat for –

How I wonder what you are.


Baa-Baa Black Sheep
