<p><u>Outdoor Treasure Hunt</u> Explore outdoors – can you find something:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hard • Soft • Colourful • Spikey • Smooth • Fluffy <p>Happy hunting!</p>	<p><u>Number Hunt</u> Take a look around the house and see how many things you can find that have numbers on them (e.g. TV remote, food packaging mobile phone, toys). Take some photographs or draw pictures to record your finds.</p>	<p><u>Make Your Own Bubbles</u> For this activity you will need a small container, a bubble wand (or small piece of wire you can bend to make a wand - like a paperclip), 300ml of water and 50ml of washing up liquid.</p>	<p><u>A Mindful Minute</u> Stop what you are doing and either stand very still or sit down for a minute. Concentrate and think what can you:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hear? • See? • Touch? • Smell? • Taste? 	<p><u>Rhyming Words</u> Listen to a rhyming story with your grown up (we chose 'There's a Bear on My Chair' for the Facebook page). Listen for the rhyming words – words that sound the same – what words can you hear? Make your own rhyming story and draw a picture (e.g. a dog on a log or a mouse in a house). Write the words/story underneath if you like.</p>
<p><u>Exploring Outdoors With All Your Senses</u> Can you use your senses to explore outdoors</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What can you see? • What can you hear? Can you hear any wildlife, what about the wind blowing? • What can you smell? • What can you feel? 	<p><u>Symmetry</u> Look online for photographs of butterflies – look closely at the patterns and colours on their wings. Both wings have exactly the same patterns and colours – this is called symmetry. Draw a picture of your favourite butterfly or design your very own butterfly – don't forget to make the wings symmetrical.</p>	<p><u>Rocket Challenge</u> Calling all budding astronauts – we have a special mission for you. Andy the astronaut has crashed his rocket – your mission is to design and build him a new rocket using any resources you like, but it must have a seat for Andy and a window so he can see out into space. Good luck! (you could build with wooden blocks, lego, duplo, junk boxes and tubes – whatever you can find)</p>	<p>Take one minute and fill your mind with what is happening right now.....</p>	<p><u>The Cheerio Challenge</u> For this activity you will need some Cheerios, a long thin stick (or pipe cleaner or piece of spaghetti) and a piece of blue tack (or play dough or plasticine). Push the stick into the blue tack so that it stands up and see how many cheerios you can put on the stick in 1 minute. Have a race with your grown up and see who gets the most cheerios on their stick.</p>



Baa-Baa Pink Sheep


Baa-Baa pink sheep have you any spots,
