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


# Nursery Home Learning Grid 11-5-20

<p><u>Monday</u></p> <p><u>Outdoor Learning</u></p> 	<p><u>Tuesday</u></p> <p><u>Early Numeracy</u></p> 	<p><u>Wednesday</u></p> <p><u>STEAM</u></p> 	<p><u>Thursday</u></p> <p><u>Health and Wellbeing</u></p> 	<p><u>Friday</u></p> <p><u>Early Literacy</u></p> 
<p><u>Nature Art</u></p> <p>Have a look outside or in the garden for stones, sticks, leaves, flowers etc. and make a model or a picture with your special finds. Take a photograph to record your creation.</p> 	<p><u>Size and Sequencing</u></p> <p><u>Big and Small</u> You will need 5 or 6 pairs of objects (one big, one small e.g. spoons, cars, balls) Ask your child to identify the biggest and smallest (you can add in middle sized to make it more challenging).</p> <p><u>Size Sequencing</u> For this you will need 6 objects of varying size – ask your child to sequence them from biggest to smallest or vice versa. Then choose an object and ask them to find you one that is bigger than or smaller than the one you are holding.</p>	<p><u>Creative Construction</u></p> <p>For this activity you will need some building materials. Something long like spaghetti, straws or cocktail sticks and something soft and squashy like marshmallows, soft sweeties, fruit or dough. Use your marshmallows to join your spaghetti together and create your model. Have fun!</p> 	<p><u>Cosmic Yoga</u></p> <p>Do your favourite cosmic yoga session with Jaimie.</p> 	<p><u>Lobster Games</u></p> <p>For this activity you will need two springy clothes pegs. Today you are Sebastian the lobster and instead of fingers you have pincers, just like a real lobster! Your challenge is to explore the house and garden and find out what you can pick up with your pincers – tiny toys, things to eat, little stones in the garden. Some things might be a little trickier than others. Good luck lobsters! (if you like you can use felt pens to decorate your pincers!)</p>
<p><u>Treasure Maps</u></p> <p>For this activity you will need pens, paper and something to hide (like a toy or teddy). Hide your toy somewhere in the house or garden and draw a treasure map to show where it is hidden. Ask someone in your family to find the treasure using the map – remember X marks the spot!</p> 	<p><u>Pattern Sequencing</u></p> <p>Can you make a pattern? (a pattern is something that repeats over and over)</p> 	<p><u>Shaving Foam Fun</u></p> <p>For this activity you will need a polythene bag (and some tape) or a tray, some shaving foam and your fingers! Cover your table top with the polythene bag and stick it down securely or use the tray. Squirt on your shaving foam and you are ready to explore</p>	<p><u>Storytelling</u></p> <p>You will need a selection of photographs or magazine pictures to play this game (a selection of people, animals, places, objects). Decide which pictures you are going to use and think about who is in the story, where they are going to go and what they are going to do. Start with 'Once upon a time.....' and tell your story – it can be a happy story, a sad one or even a bit scary or silly.</p>	<p><u>Magic Writing / Painting</u></p> <p>For this activity you need a tub with water, a paintbrush (any size) and a sunny day! Find a hard surface outside (slabs or tarmac work best) and write your message using the paintbrush and water. You will have to be quick, as the sun shines on it your message/picture will disappear like magic! You could write your own name or mummy or daddy or any words you like - you choose!</p>
