Nursery Admissions / Session 20/21

Virtual admissions panels took place earlier this month. Unfortunately, however until we receive further details from the Scottish government about the reopening of educational establishments we will not be able to confirm the sessions offered to families. This is simply because we do not yet know what our provision will look like as we move forward. This will also affect children returning to nursery next session for their pre-school year. We appreciate that the 'unknown' is frustrating and a little frightening but we thank you for your patience at this time, and as soon as we have further information we will pass details onto families.

Staffing

As you know the nursery team has undergone several staffing changes in recent months. Megan and Lesley left earlier in the year to take up new posts in Clackmannanshire and as a result we have had support from several supply ECEs and SLAs, including Vicki, Annemarie and Donna. You may also know that Gayle was successfully appointed to a permanent post with the team (she was previously on (very) long term supply with us). Finally, Catherine is hoping to appoint a new ECE within the next few weeks and a new SLA to work the opposite days of the week from Caroline – we will update you with further information once details are confirmed.

Playroom Developments

As you will be aware we were hoping to be in our new build by this point in time. Issues with the contractor and now the current lockdown situation have delayed the build somewhat. The latest information that we have been given is that the build could start as soon as next month. If all goes to plan this could hopefully see us moving into the new build next spring. We will keep you up to date with any further developments as we get them.

Transition Arrangements

We understand that it must be a worrying time for families with children moving on to P1 after the summer holidays. Please be assured that support will be put in place to support all our children moving from nursery to school, to help them settle into their new classrooms and get to know their new friends and teachers.

Although our traditional transition programme is not in place this year there will still be opportunities for children to 'meet' with their teacher and to 'see' their new classrooms.

Classroom Experiences

As part of this year's programme our P1 teachers will set up SeeSaw classrooms for children moving on to P1. These are on-line learning journals that families can access at home with their child. Your class teacher can make videos (e.g. reading stories or delivering learning activities) and share them with your child and can also receive information back from your child. In the current situation this will provide a good opportunity for the teacher to get to know her new class and for your child to meet their new teacher. Further details about SeeSaw will be sent to families soon.

All children attending nursery at Braehead will already have had the opportunity to be out and about in the school environment e.g. going for lunch, visiting the school office, taking part in gym sessions and playing in the early years open area. We appreciate that this will seem a very long time ago for most children so in addition we plan to create videos to introduce your child to their new classroom and wider school environment.

Buddies

As in previous years every child moving into P1 will be allocated a buddy from the current Primary 6 classes. Your child's big buddy will create a 'getting to know you' guide and send it to your child on SeeSaw (via their teacher). Once we are back in school your child's buddy will be able to 'show them the ropes' as they

settle into school life. A little buddy will also be allocated to your child on return to school. They will be able to include your children in their games and introduce them to life in the early years wing.
