Watch the Youtube clip to remind you what adjectives are. Then choose at least 4 adjectives to describe the scene in the picture and write some sentences.

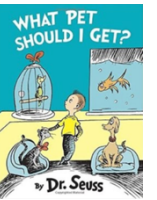


Literacy – Reading

(worksheet on SeeSaw)

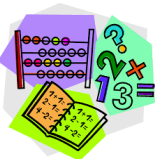
10p activity: count the coins in the piggybank and write the totals.
