- Curricular Areas: The core Curriculum areas of literacy, numeracy and health and wellbeing. Also, Science, Expressive Arts, Social Studies and Technology
- Interdisciplinary Learning (IDL) Project: IDL is a way of learning and thinking. In IDL learners draw on knowledge and understanding from two or more disciplines in order to gain new knowledge and skills, understand issues and explain or solve problems that are beyond the range of any single subject.
- Ethos and Life of the School: Christmas Show, Assemblies, OSCARS; Dojo awards and fundraising activities.
- Personal Achievement: Challenges set for children across the term at school, in class and at home.
