

Dear Parents, Carers and Children,
Here is our termly newsletter which will provide information on learning and forthcoming events for the term ahead.

Learning Contexts for Autumn Term:

We are starting this term with all classes focusing on our "Love Literacy" context. This context allows the children to develop their love for all things to do with literature and language. Each class has a focus book or novel and is undertaking a wide variety of activities relating to the stories they hear including the First Minister's Reading Challenge. This work will culminate in a celebration assembly and you will see what each class has been learning at the "Meet the Teacher" event in September (see below for more information).
Currently the classes are also taking part in lots of class community building activities as well as establishing their class charters using the United Nations Convention of the Rights of the Child.


First Minister's Reading Challenge

As part of our Love Literacy context we are engaging with the First Minister's Reading Challenge. Every child in school is being encouraged to read as many books as they can and then record their achievements on a reading tree in school. There are certificates for different amounts of books read. Each class is also visiting the local library regularly, decorating their classroom doors to represent the books they have read and listening to stories read by their teacher during "Snack – a – Story" time each day. If you would like to come in and share in or lead a story reading session with your child's class you would be most welcome, please let us know.



Callander Primary Presentation Policy

This session we are focusing on encouraging the children to make sure that all the work they produce whether written or drawn is of the highest quality- something they could be really proud of. As part of this approach we are also focusing on handwriting. We will be focusing on joining writing when a child is ready to do so and from Primary 4 upwards if your child and their class teacher decide that their presentation is of a high standard they will be awarded a pen and introduced to using a pen for some written tasks.



Parental Engagement

Engaging with parents and carers is crucial to raising attainment and ensuring that all children feel supported and progress in their learning. Below is an update on some improvements and changes that have recently been undertaken as a result of self-evaluation and improvement work involving parents and carers.

Playground Project

Following our successful bid to be awarded £10 000 at the Your Place, Your Priorities event, Phase 1 of our playground project has begun. You will see our new climbing frame has been installed and plans are underway for a trail to be built as part of Phase 2. We have been given a generous donation from Mr Shearer's family which we will use towards this phase and our parent led playground project team are currently looking at possible funding sources to supplement this. Pupil Equity Fund Survey

The Scottish Government have committed to giving schools additional funding to support raising attainment.

Following our survey at our Parent Consultation event in March the following areas were identified by parents and carers as being important interventions for our Pupil Equity

Fund to focus on:

- Children's health and wellbeing,
- Healthy living
- High quality learning experiences.

So far we have used the Pupil Equity fund to employ a learning support assistant who will specifically focus on supporting groups of children with targeted aspects of their learning. We are also in the process of buying numeracy and literacy resources to develop mental agility and reading/writing skills.

Useful information

Nut-free School

To protect children who have a severe food allergy to peanuts/nuts, it is important that there is strict avoidance to this food in order to prevent a life-threatening allergic reaction. Any exposure to peanuts/nuts may cause a life-threatening allergic reaction that requires emergency medical treatment. To reduce the chance of this occurring, we are asking that you do not send any peanut or nut containing products to school with your child that will be eaten in school.

School Car Park Safety

Can we remind parents that the school car park is for the use of staff and visitors to the school. **We would respectfully ask all other parents not to use the school car park.** It is not safe to drop your child off in the car park in the morning due to the number of cars and taxis accessing this facility. Many thanks for helping to ensure the safety of all our children.



It is important for your child to stay hydrated at school. Please can they come to school each day with a named water bottle. They can top up at our water fountain. Water bottles are available from the school office for £1.

House Badges are also available from the school office for 25p.

Reducing Illness in School

To reduce the impact of the spread of illness in school for pupils and staff please can you adhere to the following:

- A child **must not** return to school for 48 hours after their last bout of sickness or diarrhea.
Any child returning to school before this will be sent home.
- Encourage your children if they have a cough to cough into the crease of their elbow and not their hands.

Encourage your child to wash their hands after going to the toilet. We request this in school in addition to the use of hand gel in every classroom.

Reporting of Child Absence in School

Smoking in School Grounds - As a health promoting school we encourage the children to develop their understanding of how to have a healthy lifestyle in a variety of ways. We would therefore, kindly ask parents and carers to support us in this by refraining from smoking on or near to school grounds at times when the children are being picked up, dropped off or at times when the children are accessing the outdoors learning

environment.
