1. Chairs Report (Farrah Bett)

- Over the past year Farrah has continued as chair but Isla Williams stepped down from secretary role and Richard Winfield stepped down as treasurer
- Having parent reps from each year group is continuing to work well
- Farrah has continued to attend Parent Connect meetings with Stirling Council
- There have been a series of successful events through the year (details in FREG update)
- Funds in 2023/24 school year were spent on:
 - i. P7 hoodies and yearbooks;
 - ii. School trips, including Panto for whole school;
 - iii. Easter Eggs;
 - iv. Ice lollies at sports day;
 - v. Snacks for P1 Halloween party;
 - vi. Shed in playground to store items used by PC/FREG also used to store pre-loved uniforms and hope to set up a pop-up shop for this;
- Aim to continue to support enrichment of outdoor areas, including possible mural, and online resources (Seesaw etc)
- Hoping next year to possibly have Panto trip again
- Continue to support school in any activities they want help with, especially if working with wider community as well

2. FREG Update (Lisa Nicol & Farrah Bett)

- Xmas Fayre 2023 was a success with lots of good donations and raised a lot of money at just over £2200
- Decided not to do Resolution Run due to lack of interest and instead did Cambus Bar Golden Ticket which raised £310
- Family Quiz Night took on feedback from previous year to make more interactive and fun, especially for some of the younger kids. Didn't raise much money at £30-40 but was good fun and will look to hold again
- Summer Fayre/Raffle well supported by local businesses and families. Expanded to use USB events for inflatables and will continue to look to improve next year again. Did really well and took in £2480
- Pop-up café at Sports Day was well used and brought in £170
- Recent Halloween Disco was well attended and included more activities this year. Took in £100 which is lower than previous discos as lower ticket price and everything was included in ticket. Had aimed to break even so was still a good result and covered cost of snacks for the P1 party.

- Currently working to organise this years Christmas Fayre and have a good number of helpers (although always keen for more volunteers), a face painter organised, hampers made, good donations for Raffle and tickets now on sale.
- Currently 5 members in FREG and always keen to welcome new members as hard for all those currently on to make all meetings – can email cambusbarronprimaryfreg@yahoo.com
- Lisa also secured £1000 from the Rotary Club which is being used to cover the cost of laptop covers and £500 from the Community Development Trust (Windfarm grants)

 - i. There are 2 main events each year (the Fayres) and one of these covers the request from the school to support online resources etc which leaves a good amount for PC to spend
