## Dear Parent/Carer

### Children's Learning

**Willow Room**: The children have been welcoming a few new friends into the Willow Room. The staff have been observing lots of spontaneous play and learning but they are focussing very much on movement and co-ordination. They have been exploring movement playing with balls, bean bags, and sensory play.

**Acorn Room:** All the children are exploring their outdoor space and continuing to explore local wild life. They have been involved with the RSPB Bird watch and found a real nest that had fallen from a tree during one of their local walks in the community. They have also welcomed a few new friends starting in their room.

**Oak Room:** All the children have been exploring different kinds of books and listening to different stories. They have been using relevant props and puppets to re-create their stories both indoor and out. They have been focussing very much on listening to each other, following rules and being respectful to their environment. Lynne has been doing 'Learning to Listen' with all the children in the Oak Room every day and they are having such fun through these sessions. Sessions aim to demonstrate what good listening actually looks like. These are delivered through fun, playful opportunities where we have four key elements to practice.

- 1) Look at the person who is talking.
- 2) Sitting still.
- 3) Staying Quiet.
- 4) Listening to all the words.

Why don't you try these at home with your child; see if they can tell you? Watch out for our social media accounts where we will be sharing some of these games for you to have a go. Good luck! All rooms participated in World Book Day and some children came dressed up as their favourite character.
