Excursions Policy Conditions for Participation



School trips, both day and residential, can make a significant contribution to a child's education, personal development and social confidence. For this reason the staff of Dunblane High organise many school trips and encourages pupils of all ages to participate in them as fully as possible.

The safety and well-being of pupils is always the first priority in the arrangements for any school trip. Staff who accompany pupils are acutely aware of their duty of care on school trips. This care can only be discharged if pupils and their parents acknowledge that they too, must share in the responsibility for the safe and successful running of the trip.

Parents are asked to make clear to their children before they depart their own high expectations of behaviour and attitude.

It is a condition of participation in a school trip or excursion that pupils behave considerately and responsibly their own and others' safety and enjoyment, to join in with a positive attitude, and to follow the instructions and rules they are given.

Participation in school trips is conditional on acceptance of the following general rules and any other specific rules that are set for a particular trip:

- 1. Pupils, as ambassadors for our school, must conduct themselves in accordance with the highest standards of courtesy, consideration and behaviour. Pupils are expected to participate in activities with a positive and constructive attitude.
- 2. Pupils must wear school uniform, or other appropriate clothing, as outlined by staff. Clothing or other items associated with factions (eg football colours) may not be worn at any time.
- 3. Behaviour on all forms of transport is to be of the highest standards, with consideration for the safety and well-being of others, especially members of the public.
- 4. Pupils must observe any "boundary" rules (i.e. where they may and may not go) imposed by the trip/excursion leader.
- 5. The purchase, possession or use of alcohol, drugs or cigarettes, or the carrying of an item that has the potential to cause harm or any other item explicitly prohibited by the teacher-in-charge, is forbidden.
- 6. Mobile phones may only be taken on school trips if permission is given, and may be used only in accordance with the rules established by the trip/excursion leader. They are taken at the participant's own risk. Teachers cannot be responsible for or act to recover, lost or stolen phones or other electronic equipment unnecessary to the trip.
- 7. On residential trips, pupils must go to bed when instructed, and observe whatever "lights-out" rules are imposed by the teacher in charge. Pupils must not visit each other's rooms after "lights out".
- 8. On residential trips, pupils are to co-operate willingly in any chores that need doing.
- 9. On trips abroad, pupils must abide by the Customs and Excise rules relating to personal allowances for gifts and any legal restrictions on particular items.
