OUR LEARNING

BUTTERFLY BUBBLE - MISS KERRIDGE

Last term the butterflies have demonstrated a particular interest in learning about building and construction. Starting as an interest in building a shelter with Lego for the Lego characters, it developed into a fantastic garden DIY project (complete with sewage works), a prison for the 'bad guys', making concrete from sand and water, and an obstacle course for their friends to complete, to name but a few. Teamwork, critical thinking, problem solving, and fine/gross motor skills have all been put to the test with the most wonderful results. Other interests have included: investigating forces and motion (particularly things that roll), hairdressing in our role play corner and science experiments in our turf tray.





OUR LEARNING

BEE BUBBLE - MISS RAE

The children in the 'Bee' bubble have been exploring many of their wonder questions. Their questions have revolved around the moon ("I wonder why the moon is sometimes a half moon or sometimes a full moon") which led us to investigate our sun, stars, planet earth and rockets. We will continue to explore this learning into the new term to provide depth and consolidation. Another line of enquiry which was sparked from walks around the school was that of flowers and how they grow ("Granny Coco had flowers in her garden at the B&B, they grow from a seed"). This enquiry led into the exploration around flower names, how they grow, what they grow from and what we need to do to look after them. This interest has also led us to exploring the changes our seasons bring, with a focus on Spring. One of our children incubated some eggs and shared a picture of his baby chick with his peers. This sparked conversation around different bird names and what other creatures grow in an egg and hatch, some of the children's responses included birds, snakes, penguins, ducks..... Again, this interest will continue to be explored next term. Our children's interest continually changed and we never know what questions we face from our young learners, where will our lines of enquiry take us?
