



**Newton Primary School, Closure Contingency Learning Plan, Primary 5**

<p>Over the following period of time these activities offer your child the opportunity to enhance and practise the skills they have been developing in class as well as undertake a variety of differing tasks of their choosing. They also give you an idea of the type of things you can perhaps task your child with should they complete all the tasks on this sheet. There are also relevant and appropriate web sites and apps which may be of help.</p>		
<p><b>Flying the Flag</b> Create an A4 size Japan flag which is in full colour. You could draw your flag from scratch or create a collage from paper scraps or image printouts. Include a summary with the flag's history and design along with your finished piece.</p>	<p><b>Visit Japan</b> Design a poster or leaflet advertising Japan as a holiday destination.</p>	<p><b>Grand Designs</b> Create your own version of a famous Japanese landmark using lego, Minecraft or a computer drawing program.</p>
<p><b>Talk the Talk</b> Prepare a class talk on a dangerous or less known animal from Japan.</p>	<p><b>Masterchef Japan</b> Research Japanese food and put together a menu for a typical Japanese meal.</p>	<p><b>Story Teller</b> Write an imaginative story set in Japan. Use animals as characters and consider what the problem and resolution of the story can be.</p>
<p><b>Random Act of Kindness</b> Perform a random act of kindness each day to help those around you, e.g. a get well soon card or tidy your room.</p>	<p><b>Research a Sport</b> Research a sport. You might want to include name, history, famous players and rules.</p>	<p><b>Japanese Art</b> Research a Japanese artist or a famous piece of Japanese art. Research facts about the artists and create a piece of art in the style of this artist.</p>

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<p><b>Scotland vs Japan</b> Using a Venn diagram table, table or graph of your choice, compare facts comparing Scotland and Japan. It could include information about currency, habitats and living things and food.</p>	<p><b>Chimney Sums</b> Ask an adult to create at least 10 chimney sums using 2, 3 or 4 digit numbers (possibly with decimal points). You could create addition or subtraction sums. See example below:</p> $\begin{array}{r} 3681 \\ + 4205 \\ \hline \end{array}$	<p><b>Word Problems</b> Create and solve at least 5 word problems using addition, subtraction, multiplication or division. See example below:</p> <p>On Monday I read 83 pages of my book. On Tuesday I read 15 more. How many pages did I read altogether? 98 pages</p>
<p><b>Board Game</b> Create a Monopoly style board game involving buying and selling property. Your board game can have it's own theme for example Harry Potter, football teams or Minecraft.</p>	<p><b>Acrostic Poem</b> Use your senses to create an acrostic poem about the things you can see, hear, smell and feel outside. See example:</p> <p><b>B</b>eautiful, soft feathers <b>I</b>ncredible birdsong <b>R</b>adiant colours, bright and bold <b>D</b>own in my garden</p>	<p><b>Get Active</b> Create a Joe Wicks aerobic routine to your favourite song.</p> <p>Go for a walk.</p> <p>Search for Cosmic Kids yoga or Just Dance online.</p>
<p><b>Spelling</b> Access and continue to practise your spelling with Nessy. Find 10 unfamiliar or tricky words in a book you are reading and practise spelling them using a creative method such as rainbow writing or creating a wordsearch, etc.</p>	<p><b>Reading</b> Read for at least 30 minutes every day.</p>	<p><b>Current Affairs</b> Watch Newsround and compile a summary of your favourite news story. Create your own news report and record yourself or write a news article.</p>
