They also give you an idea of the type of things you can perhaps task your child with should they complete all the tasks on this sheet. There are also relevant and appropriate web sites and apps which may be of help.

LITERACY- Writing

Create a new character that David Walliams could write about. Write an adventure story featuring your character.

Mild Challenge: Include at least 2 ambitious adjectives.

Medium Challenge: Include at least 5 ambitious adjectives.

Hot Challenge: Include at least 10 ambitious adjectives.

Highlight your ambitious adjectives using a different coloured pencil.

LITERACY- Reading/Spelling

Pick ten unfamiliar words from a book you are reading at home. Find the dictionary definition of your words and use active spelling strategies to learn them. Write a sentence using each of your words. Get an adult at home to test you.

LITERACY- Writing

Write a set of instructions on how to make a paper aeroplane and then follow them to make your own. Remember to include a title, put each step in the correct order and make the instructions clear. You could even include a diagram.

Instructions include imperative verbs or 'bossy verbs'. They tell us what to do. For example; cut, measure, fold, draw. How many imperative verbs can you include in your instructions?

LITERACY- Grammar

Seven silly snakes slithered sneakily into the sausage stall.

Can you remember what alliteration means? Write ten sentences using examples of alliteration. Your sentences can be as silly as you like. Draw pictures to accompany/match your sentences.

LITERACY- Languages


Learn the British Sign Language alphabet. Can you sign your name? Teach someone in your family how to sign their name.

LITERACY – Grammar

Make a list of as many different words for said as you can think of. Think about how you can say something, use your acting skills to help you.

These words are called synonyms, they are different words that mean the same thing!

<p>MATHS- Time</p> <p>Make a time diary about parts of your day – what time do you eat breakfast, lunch and dinner? What time do you wake up and go to bed? Draw how the analogue and digital clock looks at each of these times and write how we say the time.</p> <p>Mild Challenge- stick to the nearest O'clock/ half past Medium Challenge-Use O'clock , half past, quarter past and quarter to Hot Challenge- Use 5 minute intervals. For example, Twenty Past 7 – 7:20 Ten to 11 – 10:50</p>	<p>MATHS/ ART- Time</p> <p>Make a clock face out of recyclable materials. Mark the numbers in the right place and make moveable hands.</p> <p>Be as creative as you can! Here is an example- https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=uLD915rzVQU</p>	<p>NUMERACY- Money</p> <p>Set up a shop at home with coins, price list for items under £5 and a till area. Invite customers from your home into your shop to order things. Make sure you give them a receipt – you could use column addition or subtraction to work out how much change they need.</p> <p>For example:</p> 
<p>MATHS/READING- Sumdog online learning</p> <p>Complete a variety of reading and maths challenges set on Sumdog. Make sure to click the “Maths” or “Reading” button when you play!</p>	<p>MATHS- Measure</p> <p>Using the paper aeroplane you have made, have a competition with an adult at home or a sibling to measure the distance you can through the paper aeroplanes. Record the distance in metres (m) and centimetres(cm).</p> <p>Remember there are 100 centimetres in a metre!</p>	<p>MODERN LANGUAGES/RME</p> <p>Research how Easter is celebrated in France and learn some vocabulary. For example, how do you say ‘Happy Easter!’ in French?</p> <p>Challenge: Access Quizlet and revise the French weather Vocabulary. Can you make your own flashcards? https://quizlet.com/gb/406570605/french-weather-flash-cards/</p>
<p>HEALTH AND WELLBEING- Mindfulness</p> <p>Write another list of ten things you are grateful for, has your list changed since last time?</p> <p>Follow the Cosmic Kids Yoga ‘Be the Pond’ https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=wf5K3pP2IUQ</p>	<p>HEALTH AND WELLBEING- PE</p> <p>Set up an obstacle course in your garden and time yourself completing it. Draw the obstacle course in your jotter and record the time it took to complete. Can you beat your time?</p>	<p>SCHOOL VALUES -RESPONSIBILITY</p> <p>How can you demonstrate <u>Responsibility</u> during this time? <p>Find some magnets in your house (Tip: Check the fridge!). Once you find one magnet, try to find other magnetic objects. Write a list of what the magnet sticks to. Do these objects have anything in common?</p> <p>Check out this Youtube Video on magnets and magnetism: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=yXCeuSiTOug</p>	<p>Watch Disney Pixar’s Film Toy Story (Or any other film featuring toys) and make a list of the toys that appear in the film. With your list, discuss with an adult the forces that make each of the toys move. Can you find similar or different toys in your house? What make them move?</p> <p>Discover more about forces here: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=rfeVINL7d9U</p>	<p>Pick your favourite funny moment from the film and describe what moves in the scene in a written paragraph. For example, when someone gives Mr Potato Head a slap on the back his hat, his eyebrows, eyes and ears can sometimes fall off!</p>
