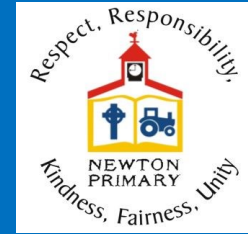
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Loose Parts Play at Newton Primary School

What are Loose Parts?



Loose parts are materials that can be moved, carried, combined, redesigned, lined up, taken apart and put back together in many different ways.



Unlike toys, they are materials with no specific set of instructions. Children can use them freely, making their own decisions about to use them.



Loose parts can be natural materials or synthetic.

- Cardboard
- Tubes and guttering
- Crates
- Pallets

- Bike wheels and car tyres
- Planks of wood
- Pots and pans
