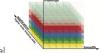
WHAT DO WE ASSESS?

- Curriculum areas
- · Interdisciplinary learning
- Opportunities for personal achievement.

WHAT DO WE CONSIDER?

 Breadth: Is there a breadth of Knowledge, Skills and Understanding



- Challenge: Can the children respond to the level of challenge? Has learning moved forward?
- Application: Can learning be applied in new and unfamiliar contexts?

ASSESSMENT EVIDENCE MAY INCLUDE:

- Pre and post topic assessments
- Peer/self/teacher assessments
- Questioning
- Video clips/ Audio clips
- Ongoing class work: jotter work, presentations, class tasks, dialogue
- · Annotated photographs
- Models / Products / Artwork
- Scottish National Standardised Assessments

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HOW DO WE SUPPORT AND CHALLENGE PROGRESS?

- Amend criteria for success to provide support/challenge
- Adopt a Staged intervention
- Regular learning conversations and review of progress using Individual Learning Records
- · Support for learning interventions
- · Additional resources including ICT
- · Peer-support/cross-stage working/buddies
- · Flexible learning and teaching approaches
