

#### **Residential Experiences**

Following a review of our current practice, discussion with Parent Council and enquiring about other schools' provision, the decision has been taken to reduce the number of residential experiences we offer. Next session, P5 will be offered the opportunity of a three day visit to Low Port Centre and P7 offered a week's visit to Belgium. We believe this still provides our children with valuable learning experiences and takes in to account the current financial climate.

#### **Money**

We currently have a high number of children with outstanding lunch money. As we don't fund the lunches, any outstanding payments have to be met by the school, which reduces funds available for all of our children. Please send any outstanding amounts as soon as possible.

The cost of milk for January to March is £9.69. Payments for milk should be made by Friday 14<sup>th</sup> December. We are sorry that we cannot accept any payments after this date.

School Fund for next term will be £3.60. All contributions are greatly appreciated and help us to provide additional experiences for our children.


