Proposed Extension Work

Our Peer Mediators from Primary 6 has recently been chosen and completed their training. The children are trained in being able to help other children with minor conflicts and this has proved to be very successful in the past. This session the Peer Mediators will be identified by their new red caps which they are very excited about wearing! Graeme Young, our Active Schools Co-ordinator, has worked with the children on being able to deliver playground games as this may be one of the ways in which they help others to get along. A number of Primary 7 children have volunteered to be Peer Mediator Leaders and they will be available to help our new peer mediator children whilst they 'learn the ropes'. The Peer Mediators will present to the school on their role at assembly in the very near future so that they are all aware of who they are and what they can help with. Miss Henderson will meet regularly with the children to offer advice and additional training, as required

<u>Big Balbardie Blether</u>

On Friday 26th October 2012, we held our first Big Balbardie Blether. This session, the children will be working in vertical house groups (children from P1-7 and Autism classes in each group). Our first Big Balbardie Blether of the year was all about the school and what the children think is important for their school to be. When they were finished all of the words they came up with were put into a big Wordle and the most highlighted words are going to be used to inform our school vision, values and aims. We are very pleased with how well the children worked together and the fantastic suggestions they came up with.

Science Report by Lewis Gemmell P5a

1. <u>Resources and Equipment</u>

Before we started our exciting experiment, we had to get all of our equipment out : One bowl of <u>BICARBONATE OF SODA</u> One beaker of <u>VINEGAR</u> One cup of <u>WATER</u> Six <u>TEST TUBES</u> One <u>SYRINGE</u> One plastic <u>SPOON</u> One <u>DROPPER</u> One test tube <u>RACK</u> that can hold six test tubes A table <u>COVER</u> for all four of the tables 2. <u>Method</u> First I used the <u>DROPPER</u> to put two mm of water into my

test tube. Next I decided to use <u>SYRINGE</u> to put an equal amount of <u>VINEGAR</u> to join the water inside my test tube. I could feel my heart pounding as my <u>TEST TUBE</u> filled with lots of little fizzing bubbles. I had just witnessed my first chemical reaction! It wasn't a major reaction but it was a start. Then I thought- what would <u>BICARBONATE OF</u> <u>SODA</u> do...

3. Conclusion

The <u>BICARBONATE OF SODA</u> didn't give me the reaction I wanted. But it did stay a solution from the start to the finish. Result : Success!
