#### Head Teacher's Comment:

It has been great to see all the children back at school and nursery after the Christmas and New Year celebrations and I hope all of our families and friends had a good time over the festive season. The children were very excited to share their adventures over the holidays and inform us about their favourite presents they received from the 'man in the big red suit'! January is a time for new beginnings and one of the busiest terms in the year and the children are well underway with their interdisciplinary learning. I am delighted to share the details of new initiatives and learning projects which will be kicking off over the next few months within this newsletter.

## Christmas School Fayre and Whole Christmas Concert



Although Christmas is but a distant memory now I would just like to let you know how proud I am of the pupils' accomplishments in this year's performance 'Lights Camel Action'. It was magnificently performed and was truly a team effort from all the staff and pupils. I would like to thank all of the parents who attended our concert and to the parent council members, staff and carers who contributed to the raffles and helped to raise money for the school and nursery fund. This was a tremendous effort by everyone and we raised a total of £800 for the school fund and £270 for the nursery fund.

#### Winter Readiness

During the winter months our main concern is the safety of the pupils and we appreciate everyone's patience if we need to use only one entrance and exit from the school when dropping off and picking up the children. Our janitors have a number of schools and buildings to open in the Blackburn area and it would not be possible for the janitorial team to clear every entrance into the school. In the event of wet and snowy weather please ensure that children come with a change of clothes in case they get wet when playing outside as there is nothing worse than siting in soggy clothes! All Nursery and School parents, carers and families are invited to attend our assembly as the children look forward to performing dances, songs and poetry in our Scottish dialect or of Robert Burns.

## Pupil Equity Funding

Myself and the staff have been very busy planning and organising a variety of fun and engaging learning experiences for the pupils at Blackburn Primary School, which will be starting soon! These initiatives are fully funded by the school's Pupil Equity Fund (PEF) and therefore will be of no charge to the pupils.

## Developing the Young Workforce



The pupils will have the opportunity to find out about the world of work and will be visiting various work places to get some work experience. These include visits to Sky Academy for P4/5 and P5/6/7, Pizza Express for P3/4, A1 and A2, a visit to the National Gallery for P5/67 and Science workshops held in the school for all pupils. ## John Muir Award/Bikeability Training

P5/6/7 pupils will be continuing with the John Muir Award and will also be learning about the environment through Bikeability training. The children will have the opportunity to discover open spaces and learn how to be safe on the roads and on cycle paths when riding bikes. This programme will be supported by our I Bike Officer Rowanne Ness who will be able to provide training and all the equipment needed to run these Bike Sessions and at the same time explore and appreciate the great outdoors.



## Literacy and Creativity



**Word Boost** Mrs kinnen will be implementing Word Boost with targeted pupils in the nursery which is a programme designed to increase children's vocabulary. This initiative will also be rolled across the school especially for pupils in P1 to P4.

**Box Clever** — Mrs Kinnaird has been a very busy bee getting resources ready to start our Box Clever initiative in the nursery with the ante preschool children. Box Clever focusses on developing children's vocabulary. Please keep an eye out when in the nursery and use the noun, adjective and verb word clouds displayed so that you can help your child learn new words at home too!

**Paired Reading** — Nursery and school staff are currently organising paired reading sessions between the nursery pupils and Blackburn Primary pupils in the upper school. Some P5/6/7 pupils will be coming round to the nursery to share a story or two with the nursery children.


#### Big Bedtime Read and Caper

Please do not drop your child off at the front entrance of the school.



# When Adults Change Everything Changes: Changes to Golden Time and Class Doio

I have worked at Blackburn Primary School now for over 10 years and have been the Head Teacher since 2011 and my core beliefs have not changed since starting my career in education over thirty years ago. I have always wanted the best for the pupils, staff and families in my care which includes having high expectations for all socially, emotionally and physically and a desire for all pupils to reach their full potential and attain and achieve at the highest level. I do not treat my position in the school lightly and I feel honoured and privileged to serve the pupils and families of Blackburn Primary

and Hopefield Nursery and am truly grateful working with the current team of teachers, nursery practitioners and support staff who have a high level of commitment and professionalism in delivering the best possible education to the pupils in their care. Everything that I do at Blackburn and Hopefield I feel is for the benefit of the pupils and families but with that comes **change** and at times some difficult decisions need to be made. An action in this session's School Improvement Plan is to revisit our school's behavior policy which has not been reviewed for some time and the staff are currently engaging in professional reading and research on behaviour. The staff team have been involved in several meetings and discussions about supporting children with behaviour and the decision to stop Golden time and Class Dojo was made collectively. The reasons these decisions were made are as follows:

- Golden Time is no longer fit for purpose as it does not relate to current practice and many schools in West Lothian have stopped Golden Time for a number of years
- Golden time was not inclusive, as not all children were allowed to bring in their own games or toys
- For a cohort of children it was not an incentive to improve behaviour

- The 'golden time chart' which was displayed in all classrooms could embarrass and shame some of the pupils who had lost golden time throughout the week
- Our teaching practice has changed considerably in the last few years and the children are getting many opportunities to learn through play in the early years and investigate and explore in the upper school. To allow 30 minutes of golden time is taking away from valuable and quality learning time which adds up considerably across the session
- The tightening of regulation on data protection and privacy under General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) has questioned the privacy standards and risks related to using Class Dojo and the Digital Learning Team within West Lothian worked with the Information Security Officer to undertake a Data Privacy Impact Assessment (DPIA). The outcome of this assessment highlighted a number of risks which relate to GDPR law and privacy rights for pupils and parents but also risks to Head Teachers and staff in terms of their rights. It was for data protection reasons that the decision was made to no longer use Class Dojo

Throughout the next few weeks we will be conducting a behaviour questionnaire for the pupils and when we receive these results we will work on updating our policy and use other strategies to support and improve behaviour across the school. I know that some pupils and parents have been upset and angered by these decisions and I hope that you will support myself and the staff in implementing change and improving behaviour.

## Hopefield Nursery Class -

The nursery children have started January 2019 with much enthusiasm at returning. Christmas is all forgotten they are happy to see their friends again.

From the first day the children have been interested in animals, birds and chickens. So, we have arranged for 'Living Chicks' to arrive with us in the next two weeks. 'I wonder where the eggs come from?' '... and the chickens,' asked some of the children. 'Are they yellow?' 'Can we eat the eggs?' 'How many will we have?' 'Can we keep them?'

There are many questions to answer. information ... Wow so much to learn and we may even keep the chickens to produce our own eggs.

In addition, we will commence our Outdoor Education next week with a visit to Peat Moss, a new area for children to investigate and explore This promotes wellbeing and wholesome physical development; muscle strength, coordination and self-confidence, resilience and problem-solving. We cannot wait to start.

The Nursery will be joining the School on the 25<sup>th</sup> January for a Burns Assembly. Please come and join us and enjoy our songs.

We also have the Book Bug coming to visit us very soon, where we will have a whole day of reading books and activities, date to be confirmed.

More exciting news is the launch of LIFT, which is an initiative to improve your children's language skills. This will involve you as a partner in supporting at home with simple and fun activities. More information will follow shortly with a date to be confirmed. We will also provide training on Learning Journals on how you can read about all the wonderful experiences your children have had in their day at nursery.

Finally, we are very sad to advise that Mrs Brogan will be leaving the Nursery on Friday after many years supporting us and making delicious food. Mrs Brodzka will leave on 1st February to take up a teaching position and we will miss her very much.

**P1/2** - We began the new term in January by welcoming two new pupils into our class and have been discussing ways in which we can help them to settle in to school life in Blackburn Primary and how we can all be good friends.

We have been busy working on designing and creating our new class "Recognition Board", where we hope to find every child's name by the end of each day.

This month, we will listen to and learn some Scottish songs and poems for our Robert Burns Assembly where we will celebrate his life and works.

Our IDL topic for this term is "Toys", where we hope to undertake a variety of interesting activities with cross curriculur links to Literacy, Expressive Arts and Technology.

In April, we have arranged an Outdoor Education visit to Polkemmet Country Park which will be led by the Ranger Service.

**A1** - It hasn't taken A1 long to get straight back into the swing of things this new term! Our older pupils in the class are looking forward to taking part in the 'Rumble!' with Limelight Music alongside A2. They will be visiting us for a 10 week block that will be focusing on using our voice, body percussion and everyday objects within music. Throughout the term we will be learning about different topics such as Scotland, Scottish Inventors and starting an enterprise project. Already for many of our children the anticipation and excitement is building towards March 21st – 22nd as we are returning to Lowport following a very successful and enjoyable residential last session. We are looking forward to all the learning and experiences we are sure to have this term!

#### P3/4 - Newsletter

P3/4 have lots of exciting plans for this term, we are going to be going to Pizza Express in Livingston on the 17th of January as part of Developing the Young Work Force. School camp will also take place this term, we are going to Lowport for 2 nights on the 6th of February where the children have chosen to do archery and rock climbing to name but a few and an information evening will be held on the 15th of January at 2.15pm. We will be using the time machines the children created to travel back in time to 3100BC to discover the wonders of Ancient Egypt - have a look at them on our Twitter page. In literacy we will be using our IDL topic to plan and write functional pieces of writing: instructions (to build a time machine), letters and invitations. We have been learning about time in maths and will continue to practice our times tables and number talks in numeracy.

**P4/5** - This term, P4/5 will be doing a topic on Healthy Eating. We are looking forward to going to Sky Academy to film a report on a Healthy Lifestyle. We will also be researching and learning about Scottish Inventors and the difference they have made to our lives. P4/5 are also excited preparing for our class assembly which will be on our Business Enterprise topic. We hope you are looking forward to it as much as we are excited about performing!

**A2** - have had a great start to 2019. We have been busy reading 'The Sleekit Mr Tod' which is Roald Dahl's Fantastic Mr Fox in Scots! It has been quite tricky to read but we have had lots of fun learning new Scottish words and all about the characters in the story.

We are very much looking forward to learning about different Famous Scots this term and the skills these people needed to earn a living. We also are very excited about our up-coming return trip to Lowport on the 21<sup>st</sup>-22<sup>nd</sup> March 2019. But before that we will be getting our news reporter hats on as we prepare for our trip to the SKY Academy where there will be lights, camera, action!

**P5/6/7** - This term will be a busy but exciting one for P5/6/7 as we have not one but two trips planned for this session!

After seeing the amazing modroc masks it is clear that we have some budding artists so the first of our trips will be to the National Galleries in Edinburgh. Our second trip will be a visit to Sky Academy where the children will be able to develop their own broadcasts for the big screen!
