# Welcome to all new children and their families to our Nursery setting What we are learning in the nursery

The clocks have changed and the windy wet weather has arrived along with the darker mornings and nights. The children have been learning all about the changes that came along with the Autumn season, by exploring the different colours of leaves on and falling from the trees, the need for warmer clothing and the lack of sunshine when they get up in the morning and when they leave Nursery from the PM session.

Halloween Week was full of dressing up, dooking for apples, singing the Halloween songs, and reading lots of stories about Mog and Meg and Funny  $\wedge$  Bones.

In preparation for bonfire night the children continued to develop their awareness and the importance of fire safety. We have been exploring the dangers of playing with matches through the story Frances Firefly and watching Miss Renwick lighting sparkles using matches and a safety lighter, from a safe zone on the other side of the nursery garden fence.

Some of the children have compared volcanos to fireworks and using their ideas to make pictures and construct models.

As Remembrance Sunday approached the children explored the meaning of caring for people in the community and the wider world and becoming a responsible citizen.

We continue to add items and information to the children's 'Consultative Planning Floorbooks'.

We promote the children's ideas and interests through the use of children's consultative planning books to provide quality play experiences.

Looking ahead: - We are sure Santa will be high on the children's agenda! It is hoped we will be able to involve the children in a small Christmas enterprise, such as a photo Calendar and possibly a small Christmas themed item for parent/carer to purchase.

This may cause serious harm to the children concerned, therefore your cooperation is greatly appreciated. Staff closely supervise and monitor food distribution and consumption during snack and pack lunch time.

## Benefits of outdoor and messy play

In Blackridge ELC we aim to bed outdoor learning and all that it promote the many benefits the Allows children the opportunity to learn through imagination and expression, helping them to develop emotional, social skills and sharing. Encourages experimental play, inspires new interests and improves cognitive skills. Encouraging children to learn about raw materials, such as mud, sand, water and paint, builds on fueling their imaginations and creativity in an unrestricted way.

#### **Absenses**

Please don't forget to notify the Nursery or School office if your child is absent or requires time off for holidays

#### Covid 19

A reminder that the symptoms are:

- •High temperature or fever
- •A new continuous cough
- •A loss of, or change in sense of smell or taste

If pupil displays symptoms of Covid 19, we will contact you to collect your child (please ensure that we have your most up to date contact details). They will be taken to the Community Wing to be collected by one adult. The pupil should, if possible, wear a face covering en route and avoid public transport. You will be asked to follow Test and Protect and we will provide you with a copy of the Test and Protect Leaflet and Step by Step Guide when your child is collected

If your child tests positive please see government guidance for up to date isolation period please ensure you notify Nursery staff or school office

#### Sickness and Diarrhea

In the interest of Health and Hygiene, please be aware that should your child have a sickness and/or diarrhea bug, they should not return to Nursery until 48hrs after all symptoms have stopped, to prevent these bugs spreading.

#### Headlice

Please remember to continue to check your child's hair regularly for signs of head lice.

#### Colds and Flu

#### **Big Bedtime Read**

Any returning children that still have their red book bag at home can they please return them along with the 5 books as soon as possible so we can complete the audit of returns. Unfortunately due to Covid 19 restriction we will be unable to resume the BBR lending library until further notice



#### **ELC Hours**

Due to Covid social distancing restrictions the Nursery drop off and pick up time have had to be adjusted to fit in with other classes in the school.

The drop off time slots for AM and 2 Full Day Children are 8am & 9am prompt.

AM pick up time slot is 12:45pm

PM drop off slot is 1:15pm

The pick-up time slots for PM and 2 Full day Children are 3:20pm / 4pm / 4:30 / 5pm / 5:30pm
Children are to be dropped off and collected from the main school entrance; Nursery staff will escort the children to and from the Nursery.

Please advise staff of your preferred pick up time slot during drop off.

We understand that there may be times when children have appointment's etc therefore please do not hesitate to speak to a member of the Nursery team to arrange an alternative drop off or pick up time

A small reminder - your child's personalised Christmas card order must be made on line and the photocopied artwork returned to Nursery as soon as possible so that the original artwork can be sent off to complete your
