

Behaviour Strategy

Children and staff agree a class charter stating what is expected from pupils and staff. Use Restorative Practices when dealing with situations.



All staff will give children warnings as agreed and displayed on door in the class

Level 1 - Verbal warning and reminder of the class charter agreed by all class members

Level 2 - Move away from partner/group to a single seat

Level 3 - Loss of 5 minutes Golden Time (sticker in diary to inform parent)

Level 4 - Pupil sent to another class on a Yellow Card, accompanied by another pupil (sticker in diary to inform parent)

Level 5 - If no change in behaviour, pupil sent to HT/DHT on a Red Card, accompanied by another pupil (sticker in diary as before)



If this or other unacceptable behaviour continues a yellow card will be given



After 3 yellow/red cards in one term class teacher will meet with parent and child to discuss the behaviour



If a further 3 cards are issued the teacher will arrange a meeting with Mrs Ireland and the parents to discuss how this can stop



If a further 3 cards are issued the teacher will arrange a meeting with Mrs Duncan and the parents to discuss how this can stop



If child's behaviour continues to be a problem a referral will be made to the Educational Psychologist, Children and Young People's Team (CYPT) and/or Primary Behaviour Support Service (PBSS) to obtain appropriate support for the child and family.
