Literacy



Common words

This week our common words are: play, look and know.

Try to think of sentences with these words in them? For example: *I know* that my dog likes to play.

If the weather is nice go outside and see if you can find materials to make these words (for example using sticks/stones). Alternatively you could use some household items (beads, raisins, clothes) to create the words. Get creative!

Writing

Imagine that you are the wolf in the story. You are very hungry and you are looking around the forest for something to eat.
Suddenly you smell a delicious cake in Little Red Riding Hood's basket. What do you do next? Use your imagination!
Start your story by writing about what you see, hear, smell etc. For example:

"One sunny day I was playing in the forest and I heard footsteps coming towards me. II could feel my tummy rumbling and I could smell the scent of a freshly baked cake in the air".

(The children should sound out the words and write down the sounds they know. You can help them by saying the word slowly. Don't worry if they don't spell the words correctly, as long as they have sounded them out by themselves.)

Once finished, draw a picture of what the wolf decided to do at the end of the story and colour in your picture.
