Then try some responses:

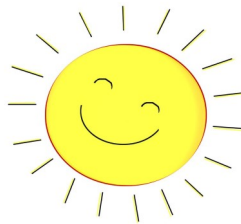
Il fait beau (It is nice)

Il fait gris (it is grey)

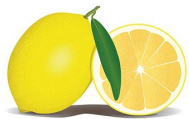
Il pleut (it's raining)

Health and Wellbeing

Using food you already have in the house (please don't feel like you need to go out and buy anything new!) prepare a 'tasting session'. Taste some food and see if you can organise the food into 4 different categories (sweet, salty, bitter and sour).

For example grapes (sweet), lemon (sour), crisps (salty) and dark chocolate (bitter).

Science

Talk to an adult about all of the things in your house that use electricity. Can you spot all of the different electrical appliances around the house in each room?
