Talk with TRUST

TRUST ideas will help your child's thinking and learning as you are doing jobs together.

I LOVE helping in the kitchen!

T Take turns to talk about the plan

What do you think we should have?

FISH FINGERS!

Ooh yeah, MUCH better than my idea!



R Recap and add to the plan

Well done! You're doing a great job!

I want smiley faces and beans with mine, I'll check what the others want...



U Use lots of encouragement

Everyone wants the same as me!

Great! What do you need to do?

I'll collect the things from the freezer and put them in the oven.




S Share and talk about experiences that will help

I'm going to put the fish fingers on this tray and the smiley faces here... Will you put them in the oven for me please?

Who usually eats all the fish fingers?

YOU DO! I'll give you the most.



When I put the dinner on I put a timer on the oven, lets check how long they need...

What else can you do whilst they're cooking?

I'll press the timer button!

I'll get plates and forks for everyone.

T Tune-in and listen to how they have helped

Wow! This is the best dinner EVER! Tell us how you made it...
