

- 3. Look at the rhyming words in the book. Is there a pattern to the rhyming? Can you think of other words that rhyme?
- 4. Draw your own character and create a rhyme to describe them.
- 5. Complete one box from the Reading Activity Grid- see on next page.
- 6. Read a book each day with someone at home and discuss the story

Write a Blurb

The Blurb is the piece of writing on the back cover of the book that tells you a little bit about the story. Write a blurb for your book.



Book Review

Write a review of the book you have read.
Inclue things like Title, Author, Favourite part, Characters and if you would recommend it to others or not.



<u>Different Ending</u> Write a different ending

for the book. What would you have changed?



Character Profile

Choose a character from the story and draw a detailed picture of them. Write a sentence about the character.

Look through your book and find words with 2 letters, 3 letters, 4 letters and 5 letters.

New Character

Make up a new character that could be in this book or story. Draw a picture of them. Then write a sentence about what they are like.



Setting

Where did the story take place? Draw a detailed picture of the setting of the story.



Sight Words



- 5. Pick 5 of your words and write a silly sentence with them in it.



Writing

- 1. Write a sentence to retell the story.
- 2. Draw a picture to show what you have written.

Remember to use a capital letter at the beginning, finger spaces in between your words and a full stop at the end.



Maths

Size Ordering



Ask an adult for three items and put them in order from the smallest to largest.

Then, ask for a different three items to put into order.

For an extra challenge, try to order five items

Outdoor Patterns



Using items that you can find outside, create a pattern.

Try leaf, stone, leaf, stone, etc. or stick, stone, grass, stick, stone, grass.

Counting

Ask an adult at home to give you a starting number (between 1 and 20). When they say "Go" start counting on in forward number sequence. What number did you reach? You can do this many times, using a different starting number each time.

Challenge Ask an adult at home to choose a number between: 0 and 10 or 10 and 20 or 20 and 30 when they say "Go" start counting backwards to reach 0.

Science- Magic Kitchen Roll Drawing (Adult Assistance Required)

You will need:

- Sharpie Pen
- Felt Tip Pens (any should work)
- Kitchen Roll Sheets
- A Plate
- Water
- A Jug

Method:

Start by folding a sheet of kitchen roll in half. On the top half of your tissue sheet you use the sharpie pen to draw a large, bold picture. You will need a protection under the tissue as the felts and sharpie will go through the tissue

Draw your picture and when you're done, open up the kitchen towel. Inside you will see that your image has came through and is visible. This is the part that you colour in with your normal felts.

You will need a plate or a tray that is white. It's important that the plate or tray doesn't have any patterns as this could stop the effectiveness of the experiment.

Using a jug/cup pour a shallow amount of water onto a plate/tray. With your kitchen towel folded over in half carefully place it into the water. Just like magic you will see the outline of your picture fill with beautiful colours.

Art and Design

Room On The Broom - Handprint Broomstick and Witch



You Will Need:

- Paints (brown, green, black, orange)
- Googly Eyes
- Pens
- Paper

Handprint Broomstick and Witch Instructions:

Paint the whole hand brown and make a sideways imprint towards the lower right side of the paper. This will be the end of the witch's broom.

Use a brown pen to make a thick line, creating the broom handle.

To create a witch, paint the palm of the hand green and the fingers black, leave the thumb clean.

Make the imprint a little above the broom to allow space for the witch's body.



Thumbprints are used to make the witch's friends.

A pair of orange thumbs make the cat.

Two brown make the dog.

A single green thumb on the broom will make the frog.

Finally, a green thumb in the air for the bird.



Give everyone some googly eyes and create a face.

The cat will need some ears, arms and legs and a tail.

The dog the same.

A tip for the frog's legs: the leg on the right side is a number 2, do the opposite for the left leg.

Add a wide grin and some arms to complete the frog.

The bird will need a beak, a wing and some small feet.

To finish off the body of the witch; create a triangle with the top red and the bottom purple. Add some stick legs and arms to complete the body.


Some simple orange hair tied up in the classic yellow bow will finish the look.
