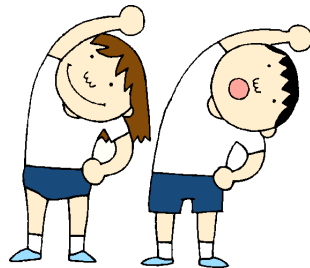




Home Learning - Week Beginning 18th May 2020

Letters and Sounds



Phonics

This week we will consolidate the sounds

n j qu

n- is a long, tongue tip sound

j- is formed by using the flat centre of the tongue

qu- is made up of 2 sounds **k** and **w**. It is both a stretchy lip sound and a short, quiet back of the throat sound

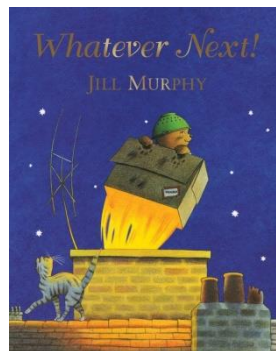

Phonics Tasks

1. Practice reading and writing different words that contain each phoneme.
2. Make letters from playdough or trace fingers in playdough to write the letter and practise saying the sound.
3. Play 'I spy' with a small range of objects. Name the objects before playing.
4. Alphabet Ball- First, the adult calls out a letter and the child responds with a word that begins with that letter. Then, the adult throws the ball to the child and the child gives the adult a letter to find a word for, and so on.
5. Try this game, looking at sounds at the end of words









Reading

1. Listen to Whatever Next (click link above) and discuss the story with someone at home- talk about your favourite part. What happened at the beginning, the middle and the end
2. Baby Bear goes 'Whoosh!' out into the night. Can you think of other words to describe how something can travel quickly (or slowly)?
3. Could you act out the story? Which characters will you need to have? Will you use any props?
4. Write/ Draw a list of equipment that you might need if you were going to travel to the moon.
5. Complete one box from the Reading Activity Grid- see on next page.
6. Read a book each day with someone at home and discuss the story

<p><u>Different Ending</u> Write a different ending for the book. What would you have changed?</p> 	<p><u>New Character</u> Make up a new character that could be in this book or story. Draw a picture of them. Then write a sentence about what they are like.</p> 	<p><u>Setting</u> Where did the story take place? Draw a detailed picture of the setting of the story.</p> 

Sight Words

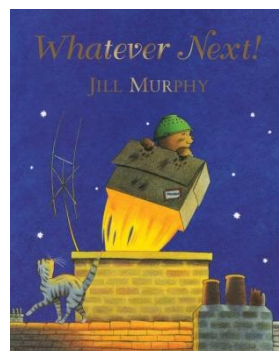

1. Practice reading and writing your sight words.
2. Pour sugar, salt or shaving cream on a tray and write your words
3. Finger Paint to spell your words!
4. BINGO! Make BINGO cards and write spelling words in boxes and randomly call out (or use flashcards) words for your child to cover
5. Flower Words - draw a flower for each word, 1 petal for each letter of the word



Writing

1. Write a sentence to retell the story.
2. Write a letter from Baby Bear to Owl a few days after their trip.

Remember to use a capital letter at the beginning, finger spaces in between your words and a full stop at the end.



Maths

Nature Counting!

Collect twigs, stones, berries, leaves, grass, pine cones etc. and match them up to a number. Start with 0 - 10 and then you can challenge yourself by using bigger numbers to 20 and beyond! These pictures will give you some ideas.



Block Subtraction!

Use blocks to build a tower 10 high. Ask someone to shout a number between 1-5. Take that amount of your tower and write the matching equation ($10-3=7$). Keep going till you reach zero.

Block Subtraction Challenge!

Can you build a block 15 high or 20 high and ask someone to shout a number between 1-5. Take that amount of your tower and write the matching equation ($20-3=17$). Keep going till you reach zero

Science- Water Fireworks! (Adult Assistance Required)

You will need:

- Water
- Oil
- Food Colouring (Any colour of your choosing)
- 16 oz clear glass
- Another 16 oz clear glass
- A Fork

Method:

1. Fill the tall glass almost to the top with room-temperature water.
2. Pour 2 tablespoons of oil into the other glass.
3. Add 2 drops of food colouring to the glass with the oil.
4. Stir the oil into the food colouring using a fork. Stop once you break the food colouring into smaller drops.
5. Pour the oil and colouring mixture into the tall glass.
6. Now watch! The food colouring will slowly sink in the glass, with each droplet expanding outwards as it falls. Looks like fireworks!

Art and Design

Make a rocket to take Baby Bear to the moon!



You Will Need:

- Toilet paper tube
- Orange/yellow paper (or blank and colour/ paint the paper)
- Aluminium foil
- Scissors
- Glue

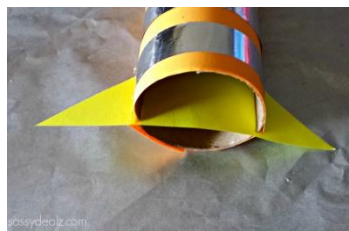
Rocket Instructions:



Start by gluing a piece of orange paper around the toilet paper roll. You can also paint it (that's more fun but takes longer!) Then cut a circle out of yellow paper and cut one slit to the middle.



Cut two strips of tin-foil and glue them on the bottom of the rocket.



Then cut a yellow triangle wider than the toilet paper roll. Cut two slits on the bottom of the toilet paper tube across from each other. The yellow paper will just slide into them.

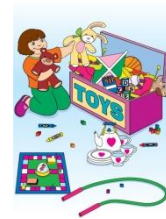


Cut out three small aluminium foil circles and glue them towards the top. Take the yellow circle and roll it into a cone, gluing it secure. You can also add red tissue paper out the end to make it look like it's flying as well.
