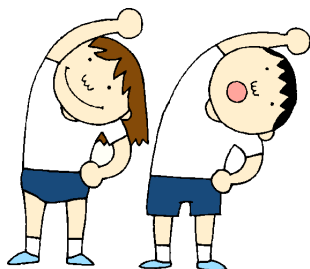




Home Learning - Week Beginning 1st June 2020

ng- is a back sound, these 2 letters together make 1 back sound

sh- is formed by using the flat centre of the tongue

oo- is a stretchy vowel and your lips smile when you say this sound- remember the ghost lives in the vowel house!

wh- is a stretchy lip sound

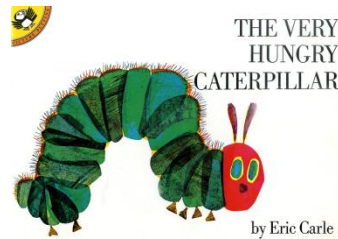

Phonics Tasks

1. Practice reading and writing different words that contain each phoneme.
2. Can you find these sounds in books, newspapers or magazines?
3. Use squirty bottle with water to write large letters on the ground, practising sound/letter name.
4. Arrange favourite toys (i.e. cars, train track into letter. Practise saying sound/letter name.
5. Use feathers, pipe cleaners, stones etc to trace a letter and practise saying the sound




1. Listen to The Very Hungry Caterpillar (click link above) and discuss the story with someone at home- talk about your favourite part. What happened at the beginning, the middle and the end
2. Can you use alliteration to describe some of the food that are eaten? (e.g. lovely lollipops, scrumptious strawberries)
3. Try to retell it to a family member/ friend. Can you remember all of the food that was eaten, in the correct order?
4. Create your own puppet show where you perform the story to an audience- maybe on facetime to another family member/ friend!
5. What sound does pear begin with? Find other foods in the story that begin with the same sound as pear- write them down!
6. Complete one box from the Reading Activity Grid- see on next page.
7. Find the rhyming words in the story.
8. Read a book each day with someone at home and discuss the story

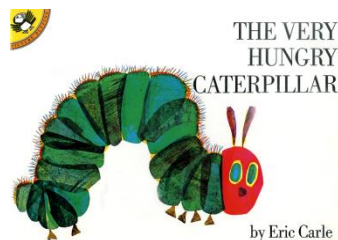
1. Practice reading and writing your sight words.

Science- The Butterfly Life Cycle! (Adult Assistance Required)

Stage 1 - The Egg

It all starts when a female butterfly lays her eggs, usually on leaves or stems of plants. Inside these tiny eggs, caterpillars grow.

Stage 2- The Caterpillar

Once ready, the caterpillar leaves its egg home and enters the big outside world! They have a big appetite - they actually eat their way out of the egg and immediately start eating the leaves of the host plant. During this stage, they shed their skin four or five times - as the caterpillar grows, its skin becomes too tight and splits open, revealing a new, larger skin underneath. A fully grown caterpillar can be over 100 times larger than when it emerged from its egg.

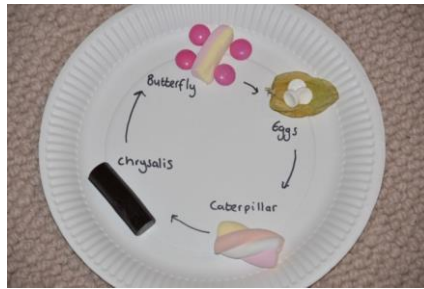
Stage 3- Chrysalis

Once fully grown, the caterpillar forms itself into a "pupa" (or chrysalis). They usually do this on twigs. The "pupa" stage may last a few weeks.. During this time, a hardened case forms around the pupa to protect it from predators and extreme weather conditions. And inside, the tissue, limbs and organs of the caterpillar transform.

Stage 4- The Butterfly

Once the butterfly is ready to emerge, the case around the pupa splits open. The wings are at first wet, soft and wrinkled against its body. The butterfly waits for its wings to dry, and pumps a liquid called hemolymph into them so that they become big and strong. Once fit for flight, the butterfly takes off into the air in search for flowers to feed on.

HOW TO MAKE AN EDIBLE BUTTERFLY LIFE CYCLE



You will need:

- Marshmallows, yoghurt raisins - **eggs**
- Sweet Caterpillars, spring onion - **caterpillars** - you could use two different sizes here to show how the caterpillar grows.
- Liquorice, long marshmallows, - **chrysalis**.
- Pasta bows, orange segments - **butterfly**
- Paper plate

Place the items in the correct order on the paper plate and add arrows to show the direction of change.

Caterpillars often shed their skin and eat lots of leaves, can you add these stages into your life cycle.

Extension

Can you make a fruit and vegetable version of the butterfly life cycle?

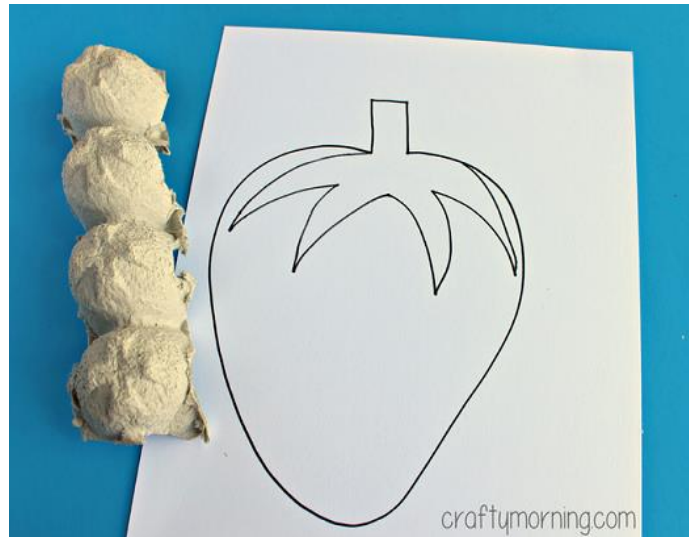
Art and Design

Egg Carton- The Very Hungry Caterpillar



You Will Need:

- Egg carton
- Green, yellow, and red paint
- Paintbrush
- Scissors / Glue
- Black marker
- Yellow pipe cleaner
- Googly eyes



Step One

Start by cutting the egg carton so it is 4 cups length! Then free-draw or print out a strawberry on a piece of white paper



Step Two

Have your child paint the first egg carton cup red and the other three green....paint in the strawberry as well! Then leave to dry



Step Three

Once the paint is dry stick a scissors/pencil into the top of the egg carton to make holes for the yellow pipe cleaner

Then glue on the googly eyes holding down for at least 30 seconds.

Cut a hole in the strawberry where the caterpillar ate and paint yellow dots all over.

Extension

You may wish to draw and paint the other foods from the story and the butterfly.

Your child could then use them to re-tell the story.





Help at Home (Always check with an adult first)

Take Time Out

Remember to take some time out to relax and spend with your loved ones.
