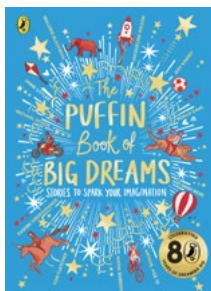

Written and illustrated by over 100 Puffin authors and illustrators

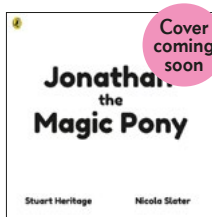
If you love: Stories that spark your imagination.

If you love: Quietly dreaming, pondering and being true to yourself.

The story: Leonard the Lion is a gentle soul who befriends Marianne, a duck. Lions are supposed to chomp ducks and Leonard must decide whether to follow the herd or be true to himself.

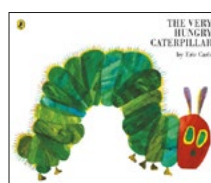


Clean Up!

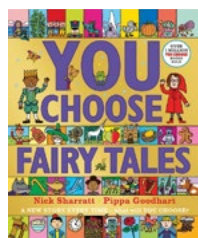

You Choose Fairy Tales

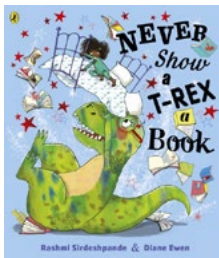
Written by Pippa Goodhart and illustrated by Nick Sharratt

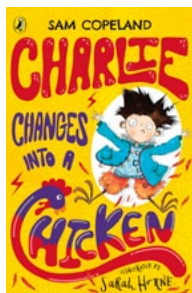


Never Show a T-Rex a Book!

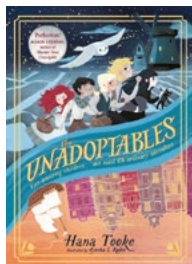


Charlie Changes into a Chicken

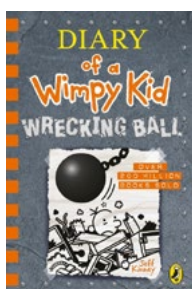


The Unadoptables

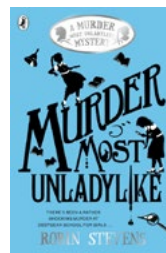


Frostheart
