- What is happening now? Page 10,11 (That is some bump on the man's head, He! He!)

- flew (ew uses the 'oo' sound)
- Can you find words that have 2 consonants but one sound? (consonants are all the letters of the alphabet apart from a,e,i,o,u)
- yelled and called are two
- Do you get pocket money? What do you spend it on/would you spend it on?

$$\begin{array}{rcc} \text{So } 1+9=10 & 10 + 90 =100 & 100+900=1000 \\ 2+8=10 & 20+80 =100 & 200+800=1000 \\ 3+7=10 & 30+70=100 & 300+700=1000 \end{array}$$
