'Gangsta Granny' pages 253 to 266

Please read the pages set above.

Today we will recap on nouns. Please look at the first paragraph on page 258. It describes the scene where the police search Granny and Ben. Make a list of the nouns in your pink Home Learning jotter. You can add the short date and give it a title, called Nouns and underline it with a ruler.

I found 16. Here they are. Gloves, bodies, handbag, guns, tissues, weapons, Ben, Granny, feet, wall, policeman, man, nose, hat, Mr Parker, neighbour.

Please read the pages above with these things to talk about, then work on the nouns activity.

Things to talk about

- On page 10, find the word 'enough'. The 'gh' uses a 'f' sound.
- On page 12, find 'thought'. This is a tricky word we need to learn.
- On page 13, the word hate has sloping letters. This is called italics. Why do you think the author has used italics for the word hate? (to make just the one word stand out and read it with emphasis)
- Can you find the words using italics on page 14 and 15 and read it with emphasis?

'Town Dog' pages 18 to 22

Please read the pages above with these things to talk about, then work on the nouns activity.

Things to talk about

- On page 18, find the word journey. We can't sound this word out but we can use what is happening in the story as a clue. This is called the context.
- Look for the word icy on page 19. This is another tricky word and can use the book context for a clue.
- At the bottom of page 19, the author says the dogs were 'jeering'. Do you know what this means? If someone is jeering, they are making fun of someone and it is an unpleasant thing to do.
- Can you find the word 'frightening' on page 21?
 Remember to chunk down a word to help you read it. Frigh-ten-ing.
- Lou-Lou can't eat her dinner. What do you think the author is telling us? I think the author wants us to know Lou-Lou is having a very unhappy start to her new home. We know this because of the things that are happening. But the book did not say this. When the author tells us things but it's not written, this is called inferred meaning'.

Things to talk about

- What genre of book is this? fact or fiction
- Look at the contents page and talk about the different sections and the pages
- Can you sound out any of the sections?
- Look at page 3 and find the word 'like' The i and e work together to make this sound like, bike, mike, like.
- Look for the word 'play'. The a and y work together to make a sound like day, May, tray, say.
- On page 4 find the word football. What 2 letters do you need for the 'oo' sound? Look at the ward ball. What is the vowel? Although we say the 'o' sound, the spelling uses an 'a' sound.
- On page 5, find the word 'kick'. What 2 letters work together but only use 1 sound?

'Sport is Fun' Nouns

Look at the picture below and make a list of nouns your pink Home Learning jotter. You can add the short date and give it a title, called Nouns and underline it with a ruler.



How many can you find? Here are mine. Girl, boy, football, net, jumper, shorts, boots, scrunchie, hair, hands, socks, ears, eyes, grass. Can you find even more?

P2 Money

For today's lesson you will need the pictures of the money from the numeracy folder. Paper money has lots of different information on it. It has the value £5, £10, £20, £50, £100. £50 and £100 notes are becoming less common to see. Here is a picture of a £50 note.





This money has been printed for The Royal Bank of Scotland and has Lord Llay on it who was an important Duke from long ago. On the reverse side it has a picture of Inverness Castle. Paper money usually has people and places on it.

Now cut out all the £5, £10 and £20 notes from the numeracy folder. We will use these to skip count and count out the value.

You should have 6, £5 notes. You can make more by drawing them if you would like to skip count to a larger amount.

First of all hold up 6 fingers and skip count each of them in 5, 10, 15, 20, 25, 30. Now count out each note and skip count as you go. 5, 10, 15, 20, 25, 30 = £30.

Do the same with the £10 notes. Hold up 6 fingers and skip count out in 10s. 10, 20, 30, 40, 50, 60.

Now count out the £10 notes, 10, 20, 30, 40, 50, 60 = £60.

How many £5 notes make £20?

How many £10 notes make £20?

Different number of notes but the same value.

P2 Money continued

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For skip counting the £20, we need to look at some number patterns. We are superb at skip counting in 2s.

4 6 8 10

We can use this pattern to skip count in 20s.

20 40 60 80 100 120

Can you see the pattern?

Now count out the £20 notes, 20, 40, 60, 80, 100, 120 = £120.

CHALLENGE

How many £20 notes make £120? We can write this calculation like this.

£20 x 6 = £120. The X means 'times' or 'multiplied by'.

How many £20 notes make £100? Can you write out the calculation?

How many £20 notes to make £80? Can you write out the calculation?

Art and Design

The Royal Mint used to be the only place that was allowed to print money. Here is a picture of it.



You would get sent to jail if you made money and tried to use it. But today you can design your own paper money in your pink Home Learning jotter. You can decide

- who will go on the obverse side
- which place will go on the reverse side
- what is the value of your money
- the bank name
- the colour of your money CHALLENGE

There is an old phrase that says 'Show me the colour of your money'. This means how much will you pay. Can you find out what colour each note is? Did you know there used to be a £1 note? What colour was it?
