## Common Words

Choose and play one of the Common Word Games in the Sounds/Common Words pack. Read the back of the game to find different ways to play. You will find a number spinner in the Number Pack.
Make a list of words you need to work on, no more than 6. Play 'BasketBall' Spelling with someone. To play ‘BasketBall’ Spelling, 2 players need a list of the words to practice. Player 1 says the first letter, player 2 says the second, player 1 the $3^{\text {rd }}$ until you have said all the letters, then together say the word out loud. If you say the word correctly, you score a point!

## Sport is Fun to the end

Things to talk about

- Look at page 6 and find the word swimming. What 2 letters do we need for ' $n g$ '?
- Lets look at the word 'like'. It was 2 vowels that work together. They are i and $e$. The $i$ is in charge and uses its name 'like', bike, hike.
- Can you read the sentences in on page 6?
- Look at page 7 and find the word pool. What 2 letters do we need for the 'oo'?
- Find the word kick. What 2 letters make the c sound at the end?
- Can you find the word running? What 2 sounds do we need for the $n g$ '?
- Can you find the word 'like'? Try to read the sentences.
- Look at page 9 and find the word that uses 'oo'. What is the word?
- What sport is on pages 10 and 11? Can you find the word cricket? What 2 letters make the middle sound in cricket?
- Try to read the sentences on pages 10 and 11.
- On page 11 find the word ball. If we sound it out it does not make sense. Here are some words that are similar. Ball, fall, tall, mall, call, hall
- Lets look at the index on page 12. This tells us where to find out about different sports.
- Now go back to the beginning of the book and click on the green bug activities.


## P1 Money

For today's lesson you will need the pictures of the coins from the numeracy folder. Cut out all the coins and put them in an envelope to keep them safe. We wil use these a lot over the next few weeks.
Coins have the value on one side and part of pictures on the other.


Can you put the pictures together? What does it make?

## P1 Money continued

Coins have the value on them. Lay out one of each and look for the value.


There are words around the edge of each coin and the value at the bottom. The size of the coins doesn't match the value. 1p is a bigger coin than the 5 p coin but 5 p has more value.

Keep out 1 ps, 2 ps, and 5 ps . We are going to make 5 p in different ways.

We know that $1+1+1+1+1=5$.
We know that $1+1+1+2=5$. Or $1+2+2=5$
It is the same for coins and adding up money.
$1 p+1 p+1 p+1 p+1 p=5 p$
$1 p+1 p+1 p+2 p=5 p$ and $1 p+2 p+2 p=5 p$

## P1 Money continued

Making 5 p in different ways.


Here is the problem to be solved. There are 4 children and each need to have 5 p in their wallets to spend on the penny tuck shop. They all have different coins in their wallets. Put coins in the wallets to add up to 5 p. The first one is done for you. CHALLENGE Can you write the calculation underneath? Remember to use the $p$ for pence.

$5 p+0=5 p$
