We suggest you focus on the following chapters: A Continent to Discover, A Journey Through Time, Forty Famous Faces, The Story of the European Union, What the EU Does, and How the EU Takes Decisions. This is also available in other European languages.




United in Diversity: This is back in print this year and introduces children to the cultural, scientific and natural heritage of the countries that make up the European Union.

For the Euroquiz language comprehension (Round 2) French, German, Spanish and Italian will be included.



The Mystery of the Golden Stars: This story book resource allows children to discover something about what the EU is; how it works and how it may be relevant to them, in a fun and stimulating way. The activities take a cross-curricular approach, including six different links to the curriculum (Geography, Maths, History, English, Science and Design & Technology). Each activity is prefaced by a chapter from the story book, as an introduction to the task.
