- Making fact families to explore the relationship between multiplication and division

- Measurement- length, weight, volume and capacity
- Chance and certainty
- Angles, symmetry and transformation

- Substance use and misuse how to store and administer medicine safely
- Emergency situations and people who help us
- Friendship explore what makes a good friend
