<p><b>Task 1</b></p> <p>What shapes can you find around your home? Organise them into groups of 2D and 3D. Name each of the shapes and post pictures of any shapes you are unsure of.</p>	<p><b>Task 4</b></p> <p>Choose a book to read on your own or with an adult. Are there any words that you don't know the meaning of? What clarifying strategies could you use? For example, looking up in a dictionary.</p>	<p><b>Task 7</b></p> <p>Create a poster or a drama to explain how to stay safe in the darker mornings and evenings. E.g. wearing bright clothing, dressing warmly.</p>	<p><b>Task 9</b></p> <p>Once you receive your read, write, count bag, use the resources and games within it.</p>
<p><b>Task 2</b></p> <p>Play the <a href="#">Number Fact Families</a> game on Topmarks to practise addition and subtraction relationships. Choose a level that suits you.</p>	<p><b>Task 5</b></p> <p>Using your spelling sounds for the week, go on a sound walk and see if you can find things that contain your sound (for example, street light for igh)</p>	<p><b>Task 8</b></p> <p>Emotion Charades: with a family member or friend, show an emotion using your face only. Your partner has to correctly guess what emotion this is.</p>	<p><b>Task 10</b></p> <p>Talk to an adult and see if they have any interesting stories they could share. This could be religious, cultural or something that has been passed down through the family.</p>
<p><b>Task 3</b></p> <p>Ask an adult to choose a number between one and a hundred. Starting at this number, count forward and backwards for as long as you can.</p>	<p><b>Task 6</b></p> <p>Look at your reading book this week. Think of some questions about the book to ask someone in your family.</p>	<p><b>Sumdog</b></p> <p>Check out the challenge set on Sumdog.</p>	<p><b>Language Nut</b></p> <p>Practise saying and responding to the French greetings we have been learning in class. Complete the Colour and Number challenge on languagenut.</p>
