This is an overview of all learning experiences offered. These experiences may be differentiated to support and challenge each child at their current stage and journey in learning.

English & Literacy

Listening and Talking

- Presentation skills: Exploring presenting to a larger audience through our clan assembly. We will be focusing on the skills: using the correct voice and speaking clearly at different times, using eye contact and continuing to use props when presenting.
- Core listening skills: listening carefully, showing respect by listening and responding to others, asking and responding to questions and showing active listening when others are talking.

<u>Writing</u>

- Further exploration of Information Reports using Scotland as our topic.
- Introduce the genre of procedure by looking at recipes, instructions and directions etc.
- Focus on sentence structure and core writing targets.

Reading

- Identifying and exploring fiction and non-fiction texts with reference to our Scotland topic.
- Reciprocal reading strategies: summarising, questioning, clarifying and predicting skills.
- Note-taking skills.
- Building fluency and expression when reading

• French: weather, body and clothes.

Numeracy & Maths

Numeracy

- Multiplication and Division- exploring the relationship between the 2, 4 and 8 times table.
- Fractions- making, describing and locating fifths, tenths, thirds and sixths on a number line, and comparing simple equivalence in fractions.
- Continue to develop numeracy strategies through Number Talks with a focus on multiplication and division
- Time exploring o'clock, quarter past, half past and quarter to using digital and analogue clocks.

Health and Wellbeing

- Focus on Scottish country dancing, invasion games and ball skills.

Interdisciplinary Learning

Scottish Inventors

Pupils will use their own research skills to explore the inventions of famous Scots through virtual museums. They will recognise that these inventions have changed the way we live. They will share their learning with the rest of the school and their families at their clan assemblies. Therefore, pupils will be learning within their own clans this term for their IDL time.

The pupils created the following questions which will be explored through our learning:

- Where did the television come from?
- How do people see things closely in space?
- Why are there so many boy inventors?
- Are there Scottish inventors? What did they make?
