Task 1

Draw 5 different flags, they all must contain either; orange, green, yellow or white in them. Name them and find out 3 interesting facts about them - create a poster to show your learning.

Extension: are there any colours which are not in any European flag? If so, which one and why do you think this is?

Task 5

Create a paper aeroplane. Measure how far it flies.

Can you adapt the aeroplane to make it fly further? Note down the changes you've made and the distance it has covered.

Task 2

Research: find out how the European Union was formed and which countries were involved. (You can use the 'European Union Facts' on Ben Lawers channel.

Write a 150-200-word informative essay about what you have learned.

Challenge: create a timeline of countries that entered the EU (first to last)

Task 6

Can you design your own exercise video?

Watch videos by Joe Wicks and other creators.

Plan your exercises, practice your presentation skills by writing a script and rehearsing it Then, video yourself doing them.

This can be done individually or with friends!

Task 3

Please find a weekly spelling list on Teams 'Ben Lawers home learning' channel.

Practice spelling the words, putting them into context (i.e. a sentence) and finding the meaning of them. You will also find the active spelling strategy of the week.

Task 4

Can you find out the biggest and smallest country in Europe (by land mass) and determine what percentage of Europe they cover.

Are there any countries in Africa, America or Asia which are similar in percentage coverage?

What about the smallest country in Europe?

Task 7

Find out what the 5 happiest countries in Europe are.

Why do you think people are happier here than the other countries?

Challenge: can you find out how this data was collected and how they measure what 'happy' means?

Task 8

Using the map of Europe found on Teams (Ben Lawers channel) complete these challenges:

Write down anything new or surprising that you have learned after looking at the map (i.e. size of countries, countries you have never heard of, location etc).

Recreate the map by drawing it out — challenge: can you draw this online? (click here for a sketching website).

Extension: label the map and colour the countries in based on the colour of their flags.
