# Calderwood Communicates: Primary 4 Termly Learning Letter Term 3 2023/24



Welcome to term 3 at Calderwood! We had fantastic end term 2 raising £70 in our Christmas enterprise fayre. For this new term we have planned lots of exciting learning experiences for and with our children in the P4 clans. We will be exploring the local history and geography of East Calder. We will be investigating the old and new village, mining community and key landmarks. This will run parallel with our learning around Scotland. We will be experiencing Scottish foods, music, dances and poems.

This is an overview of all learning experiences offered. These experiences may be differentiated to support and challenge each child.

#### English & Literacy

#### Listening and Talking

- Poetry Recital: reading and understanding Scottish language. We will be memorising a popular poem and reciting poems with added expressions and actions.
- Core Listening Skills; We will show respect by listening to other and giving positive feedback.

#### Writing

- Poetry genre focusing the Scots language.
- Spelling focus will be translating from Scots to English as well as continuing to develop our understanding of spelling rules.
- Core writing targets; separating ideas, consistent punctuation, regularly spelling common words correctly.

#### **Reading**

- Reading and understanding Scottish poems.
- Answering literal, inferential and evaluative questions using a structured sentence.
- Beginning to develop our skimming and scanning skills.
- Reciprocal reading skills focusing on predicting and clarifying.
