Welcome to Term 4! Following on from the success of last term, we are looking forward to creating the 'Smoothie Bar' model with our clans. This was chosen by our community as the most equitable way to spend the Participatory Budget the school was awarded. We now have the opportunity to develop our skills through creating different flavours of smoothie and snacks in order to share them with the 'Calderwood Cuppa' pupils each week. We are also very much looking forward to our transition into Primary 7 and the responsibility of being a buddy.

This is an overview of all learning experiences offered. These experiences may be differentiated to support and challenge each child.

English & Literacy

Listening and Talking

To further extend our listening and talking with unfamiliar people, in new environments, which we were developing last term; we will be actively practising our communication skills with our nursery buddies. Some of us will be taking on a more challenging experience through the number of buddies we will be supporting.

<u>Writing</u>

Our genres this term are poetry, persuasion and recount. We will be using the topic of 'Climate Change' to develop our poetry and persuasion skills and for our recount, will be looking back over the course of the year and will write about all our successes and challenges.

Reading

We will be exploring examples of poetry and persuasive texts to extend our knowledge of the features and structures of these texts.

We will be able to identify rhyme, rhythm, assonance, similes, metaphors, alliteration, onomatopoeia and actively focusing on accurate spelling.

The reading skills we are practising this term are questioning and clarifying and we will be looking at what inference is and how to interpret clues from a text.

We will be able to identify all of these key features within unfamiliar texts.

Numeracy & Maths

Numeracy

- Mathematical Discourse Problem solving and using mathematical vocabulary with peers
- Numeracy Continuing to develop understanding of fractions, decimals and percentages across different contexts and linking this to number patterns to further challenge learners in this area
- Number function machines exploring the four operations one step and two steps
- Number patterns including Fibonacci, Pascal's Triangle, Cube Numbers, Triangle Numbers, Square Numbers, and exploring different visual patterns and how they relate to number patterns.

- Symmetry
- Scale and enlargement
- Ideas of Chance and Uncertainty
