How many different ways can you split these into 2 groups to make 10?</p> 	<p>Task 4 Use your Rollercoaster Arm reading trick to read words in your environment. Can you look for words with 3 or 4 sounds?</p> 	<p>Task 7 Practise putting jackets, shoes and winter weather clothing on independently. Can you zip your jacket up by yourself? Can you tie your laces?</p>	<p>Task 10 Can you go on a seasonal walk and spot the changes taking place around us? Are the colours changing? What is the weather like? How does it make you feel?</p> 
<p>Task 2 What patterns can you make or see? Can you create a pattern using colours, shapes, numbers or other objects?</p> 	<p>Task 5 Practise reading the weekly tricky words. Can you spot them in any of your books at home? Can you make these with tin foil? Can you write it with coloured pens/paint?</p>	<p>Task 8 Can you spend quality time with your family each week? For example, go on a seasonal walk, practise your catching and throwing skills, help to make dinner or enjoy a movie night.</p>	<p>Nativity Practise the songs and actions from our Nativity. If you have a speaking role, practise your character's lines (link will be provided nearer the time).</p> 
<p>Task 3 How many are there? Collect a few of any object such as toy cars or fruit. How many are there? How many of each colour? How many more to make 10 etc.</p>	<p>Task 6 Can you use objects/images in your house to create and sequence a story? Can you retell this using your storyteller voice?</p>	<p>Task 9 Access the TopMarks website and practise ordering numbers forwards and backwards using the Caterpillar ordering game: https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/3-5-years/counting</p>	<p>French Practice your French greetings such as Bonjour and Au revoir.</p>
