- Taking relevant and informative notes.
- Skimming and scanning a text to find relevant information.
- We will also continue to focus on our key reciprocal reading skills; predicting, clarifying, visualising, questioning and summarising.

# **Numeracy & Maths**

#### Numeracy

- Mental Maths selecting the most efficient strategy for solving multiplication and division problems.

## Maths

- Angles identifying different types of angles and using a protractor to check angles; recognise the 4 points of a compass and the connections to right angles.
- Shape recognising and accurately drawing 2D shapes, describing 3D shapes using relevant vocabulary, develop an understanding of what the radius and diameter of a circle are.
