Numeracy

- Split a whole into smaller parts and explain that equal parts are the same size
- Share out a group of items equally into smaller groups

Measurement

 Further exploration of length, weight, volume and capacity, using real life experiences where possible.

Maths

- Read analogue and digital o'clock times (12 hour only) and represent this on a digital display or clock face
- Use appropriate language when discussing time, including before, after, o'clock, hour hand and minute hand
- Consolidating days of the week, months of the year and seasons.

- Emotion Works be aware of and able to express own feelings and develop the ability to talk about them
- Friendships care and show respect for self and others
