

# **General notices**

#### **Pupil absence**

Please contact the school by 9.30am if your child is going to be absent from school. A Groupcall message will be issued to parents who have not contacted the office – failure to respond will result in the Safe Arrivals Team being contacted.

#### Late/Early Arrivals

We have noticed a number of latecomers recently. Please be reminded that school starts at 8.45 a.m. and playground staff are in place from 8.25 a.m. We ask that children do not arrive at school before 8.25 a.m. unless they are attending Breakfast Club which starts at 8.10 a.m.

West Lothian does not permit the dropping off / collecting of children from the car park. This is due to the size of the car park and safety of children. Please do not bring your car into our car park as there will be an accident and this is not something that any of us want to see. We are currently discussing this with the council.

### **School Uniform**

(as stated in our School Handbook)

The school uniform is as follows:-

- White shirt / blouse
- Black shoes
- Navy blue cardigan
- Navy Blue Sweatshirt with school badge
- Gold or Red Polo-shirt
- School tie

Please note that black (jumpers, cardigans, hoodies) are not part of the Dedridge Primary School uniform.

#### Photography in School

Following advice from Police Scotland we (Dedridge Primary and Glenvue Nursery School) have taken the decision that we will no longer allow photography or video recording of children by parents/carers when attending school events. This decision has been taken for the protection and safety of all pupils.

**<u>Ipayimpact</u>** – We are keen that all parents/carers to register for Ipayimpact as all trips and events will be offered through the online payment system. Once you have registered school meals can be ordered in advance (even if your child is in receipt of free meals). We will issue login details again shortly for those parents/carers who have not yet activated their account.

#### Parent helpers

As always, we are very keen to involve you as much as we can in the upcoming session. Please let us know of ways that you feel that you can support the school whether this be through working in the classrooms, supporting on trips, fundraising or on the Parent Council. A PVG application will have to be completed before you are able to help us in school, these are available from the school office upon request.

<u>Head Lice</u> – Unfortunately children from time to time get infected with head lice. Please check your child's head regularly and treat any infestations when found. Advice on how to detect, treat and prevent are available from NHS Health Scotland. www.healthscotland.com

#### **Bicycles and Scooters**

Please remind your child that if they bring a bike or scooter to school they should not ride them within the playground at the beginning or end of the day. Children should dismount and walk their bikes to the bike rack in Area C playground before locking them. Cycle helmets should be worn for safety. Any child found riding a bike in the playground will be reminded of the rules.

# Reminders

#### \*\*\*Peanut/Nut/Sesame Seed Allergy\*\*\*

We have children in the school who have an allergy to peanuts and nuts. I would ask that children throughout school **do not bring nuts, sesame seeds or peanut butter** sandwiches for lunch or snack. As you will appreciate contact with nuts could be fatal for these children.

- Please label all clothes.
- Please check your child's hair for headlice regularly.
- School uniform should be worn every day no black jumpers/cardigans.
- Jeans, earrings (other than studs), slippers as indoor footwear, drinks in class (other than water) are not allowed.
- Mobile phones must be given to the class teacher to be sent to the office for safe keeping at the beginning of the day and collected at the end of the day.
- School meals are £1. 97 per day. Payment can be made online through iPayimpact.
- Dogs must not be brought into the school grounds.

#### **Charity/Fund Raising**

Thank you for your continued generosity. We have been able to make the following donations on behalf of the school and nursery through the children's fund raising efforts.

Macmillan Cancer Support - £340.15 Children in Need - £250.91 Save the Children (Christmas Jumper Day) – £115.97 School Book Fair - £92.20 earned in commission for free books for the school Rag Bag (School Textile Bank) £60.25 since August

**Christmas Fair** – on the day we raised £912. After Panto, parties and Christmas activity expenditure have been taken into account it leaves a net amount of £578. This amount goes into our school fund account and is used for subsidizing future trips and events for children. All trips are subsidized before we request contributions from you. Thank you.

**Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> March – Rag Bag collection** – we will be participating in a Rag Bag collection. Bags will be distributed in the next few weeks. Have a clear out at home and fill your bag with clean good quality adult and children's clothing, shoes, belts hats (no bric-a-brac). Your bag should be returned to school on Wednesday 7th<sup>th</sup> March by 9.00 a.m. (we have limited storage so please only bring it in on this date). Proceeds from the Rag Bag collection will be added to school fund.

**Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> March** we will be supporting the **Lots of Socks** campaign in aid of **Down's Syndrome Scotland**. This will be a dress down day and pupils can wear odd socks, lots of socks, one sock, brightly coloured socks, mismatched socks or any variation of socks. The more inventive they are in how they wear their socks the better! A suggested donation of £1 is requested.



# **Dates for your Diary**

#### **Child Protection**

We follow West Lothian child protection procedures in school. All staff have been trained in the updated procedures and are clear of their duties and responsibilities in this area. As a parent you should be aware that if the school staff have any cause of concern or evidence of abuse, we have a contractual duty to report this to either Social Work, Police or Health immediately. This is without prior notification to the parents. Please understand that this is better in the interests of all children's safety and protection for us to err on the side of caution and we would rather apologies for mistakes and/or errors of judgement than not following up concerns or evidence and allow for a child to be put at risk, seriously hurt or harmed. A full copy of our Child Protection Policy is available on request. **West Lothian Child Protection Committee (CPC)** has its own website. The website describes the work of the CPC, advises the public of who to contact if they have a concern about a child and what the agencies do once they receive information.

The website contains the contact details of organisations who can help adults deal with their own problems and contains information for children and young people about the child protection process, their rights and where they can get help. Hopefully people will feel more confident passing their concerns on knowing what happens once the information is received. The website address is <u>www.childprotectionwestlothian.org.uk</u>
