Can you build a house without using square shapes?



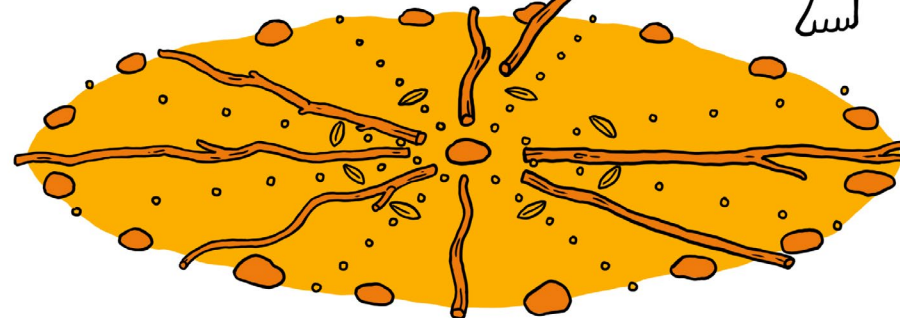

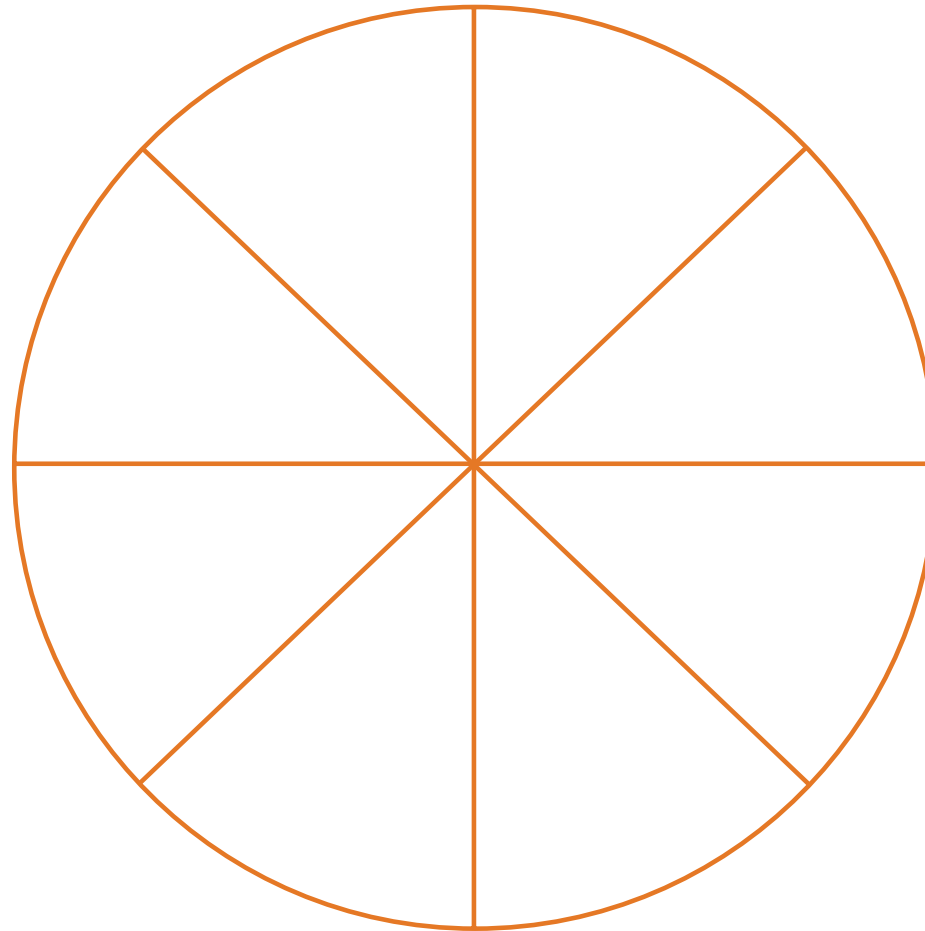

Do you know about mandalas? Mandalas are round patterns that you can color when you need to relax and have your head feel calm. Try to draw your own mandala. You will need: pencil, eraser, markers in pretty colors and maybe a ruler.
