Primary 3/2, 3 and 4/3 are coming to the end of their Romans topic. Pupils, staff and parents have all thoroughly enjoyed following Marcus' iourney from Rome to the Antonine Wall in Caledonia. We have found out lots interesting facts along the way - some more pleasant than others. Did you know for example that ancient Romans would burp to show that they had enjoyed a meal? When they had eaten too much, they would tickle their throat with a feather so they would be sick allowing them to start eating all over again! The pupils also loved the fact that the Romans did not have toilet paper and would use a sponge on a stick instead - yuck! We also discovered that we have a lot to thank the Romans for such as central heating, flushing toilets, straight roads and hot baths. The pupils loved taking part in the many craft activities and developing their artistic and technology skills. A scary Roman soldier called Decimus Gaius came to visit and brought along lots of Roman artefacts and equipment. The pupils practised their marching and making a defensive "tortoise" formation. The children were keen to share their learning with their families so we invited them along to our

classrooms to see what we had done. To finish our topic we dressed as Roman soldiers to parade around the school. We enjoyed showing off our fantastic helmets, daggers and shields.
