

Learning Rounds




On Monday 30th January 2018 members of our Quality Improvement Partnership (Armadale PS and Whitdale PS) joined us to take part in a Learning Round. The focus of this was on the totality of the curriculum and the learning experiences across the curriculum for all of our children. We were delighted that the team including members of the Kirkhill team were able to validate our self-evaluation and highlighted the following key strengths:

- * The nurturing, caring ethos in the school.
- * Well behaved and polite children.
- Positive relationships between children and staff and each other.
- Vision, values and aims clearly evident across the whole school community and embedded into the work of the school.
- * Children engaged in learning activities and being supported and challenged, when required.
- Positive feedback from class teachers who give children encouragement to achieve to their full potential.
- Displays across the school are relevant to the learning taking place across the school and the engagement of children in learning.
- High expectations of learning shared with children and consistently applied across the school with class teachers engaging in learning activities with children.
- * Curriculum Journey is reflective of curriculum rationale and shows clear progression.
- * Teacher leadership clearly linked to SIP priorities.

Vision, Values and Aims

We are delighted to have our Vision, Values and Aims poster on display across the school which links to our school ethos. All of our children should now have brought a postcard with the poster on it home with them to share with you. Professional Learning

Our staff team have continued to engage in professional learning with the following staff learning taking place:

Mrs McCann continues to develop coaching skills through her participation in the West Lothian Coaching for Success programme. Mrs MacMillan, Mrs Alston and Miss Brown have visited other schools in West Lothian to learn more about autism and Primary 1. Miss Thomson delivered a very informative session to teaching staff on IZAK 9 and how this can be used to help develop problem solving skills in maths. Mrs McDonnell led the staff in a training session on floorbook planning which is currently well used in the nursery and is now evident at other stages in the school. Mrs Shankland and Mrs Bowden attended training in Glasgow on supporting older children with autism in mainstream schools. A number of our staff have been reading 'When the Adults Change Everything Changes' by Paul Dix to inform their professional practice. Mrs Sneddon attended a weekend training session on Bal-a-vis-x to support children in play therapy. All teaching staff

continue to work with cluster colleagues in Professional Learning Groups to carry out practitioner enquiry projects on Reflective Reading.
