When the **BIG** hand moves **half-way** round the clock, it is at the **6**.

The time reads as **half past** the hour.

Telling the Time on the Hour

When the **BIG** hand is pointing to 12, the small hand tells you what the hour (**o'clock**) is.

This clock reads **4 o'clock.**



Be able to tell
the time -
o'clock only.
