



Chuck the Chick




On a farm, near the coast, a farmer kept animals. He had dogs, cats, sheep, goats and hens.




The hens laid eggs. In the winter, a red hen laid a big egg.



The egg got such a big crack in. In the egg, was a soft chick. Chuck was the chick. His mum fed him and got him a soft bed.




For his dinner, Chuck had seeds and nuts. The seeds and nuts went 'crunch'.
