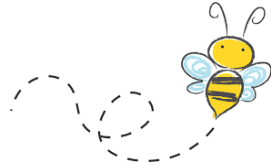


This week we are going to ask you to produce a project about bees.

You could:

- Make an information book
- Make a poster
- An information report
- A powerpoint



Or you might have an even better idea.

Think about how you are going to share your information.

Do you have headings or chapters?

For example:

- Parts of a bee's body
- How honey is made?

Could you put in a labelled picture?

You can add in extra information of your own as well.

Extra activity – Try to make your own honeycomb picture. Cut a hexagon out of card and use it to make a [tessellating pattern](#) (remember that means joined together with no gaps or overlapping). Or try this craft ([click here](#)).
