Writing

Write a story and draw a detailed picture.

Number

Explore, recognise and describe 2D shapes using words like straight, round, flat and curved.

Use the 2D Shape Word Mat to look at different shapes.

1. **Make a Shape Collage**

Draw different 2D shapes to make a picture. Colour in your picture. Try to use a different colour for every shape so all the shapes show up clearly.

2. **2D Shape Flashcards**

Look at the 2D Shape Flashcards sheet. Make a set of your own 2D shape flashcards. Use your cards to learn the names of the shapes. Teach other family members the names of your shapes.

3. **2D Shape Hunt**

Go on a shape hunt around your house. Challenge yourself to see how many 2D shapes you can find. You could also look for shapes when you are outdoors. You could record these in your jotter.

4. **HAM**

There will be some shape related activities for you to work on. There will also be other number activities for you work on, too.



Remember to keep counting forwards and backwards every day. Start from different numbers each time.
