VSE Report Highlights



- Progressive, skills-based progression pathways developed from experiences and outcomes are being
 implemented in all curriculum areas with a focus on maths and language to ensure breadth, depth and
 progression in learning across the school.
- The use of ICT to support learning is increasing and is well integrated at second level.
- Leadership at all levels is developing through a range of working groups and coordinator roles of which staff
 are encouraged to take ownership in order to drive forward improvement across the school. Collaborative
 clusters now allow teachers to plan across stages to ensure consistency of learning for pupils and to ensure
 progression within a level which is leading to improved learning experiences for pupils
- The nursery curriculum provides valuable opportunities for the development of talking and listening skills through role play and real life experiences, for example the pizza restaurant and visits to the post office.
- We have effective partnership working which makes a difference to the quality of support for learners. Staff
